Houghton Lake and Lake St. Helen were frozen over, and in use by fishermen before Christmas, and some good catches of pike and bluegills were reported.

Some deep-water lakes, such as Higgins in Roscommon County, were not in use by fishermen, although ice was beginning to form.

Pike were being taken by fishermen using "tip-ups" baited with large minnows; bluegills were biting on corn-borers, wigglers, small minnows and worms.

Hunting pressure was light throughout the region, though some hunters reported good success. General snows made it difficult to see snowshoe hares, now turned white in their winter coats.

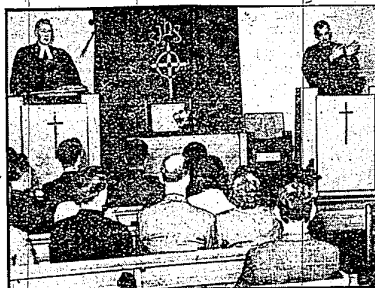
FISHERMEN, TAKE NOTE!

Rural Health Conference To Be At Michigan State College January 16 - 17

The sixth annual Michigan Rural Health conference, scheduled for January 16 and 17, 1953, at the Kellogg Center, E. Lansing, will bring together outstanding authorities in six important health topics according to Milton Grinnell, local chairman of the conference.

Among the resource persons who will discuss recent developments in the respective subjects are: David Dickinson, M.D., director Polio Respirator Center, U. of M.; Paul S. Barker, M.D., professor of internal medicine, O. M. School of Medicine; John G. Bielawski, M.D., Detroit, medical director, Michigan Heart Association; Leon DeVet, M.D., Grand Rapids; and Frank Von Schoch, M.D., Jackson, member Rheumatoid Fever committee of Michigan State Medical Society will discuss recent advances in that disease.

Latest developments in cancer will be discussed by Harry M. Nelson, M.D., Detroit, president of the American Cancer Society, and Robert W. Dutton, M.D., Ann Arbor, associate professor of Surgery at U. of M., and a group discussion on new drugs will be led by Wm. Robinson, M.D., associate professor of internal medicine, U. of M., and George B. Wolter, Detroit, representing the Michigan State Pharmaceutical Association.

A special discussion session on "Animal Diseases that Affect Man" will be headed by Professor H. J. Statens, East Lansing, department of Zoology and public health of Michigan State College, and W. M. Decker, Lansing, Public Health Veterinarian, Michigan Department of Health.

Mr. Grinnell pointed out that, in response to many requests, ample time will be provided in this year's program for audience participation. Experienced discussion leaders from Michigan Universities and Colleges will serve in each of the six group meetings which will run concurrently, according to Mr. Grinnell.

The two-day meeting, which will open at 10:00 a.m. Friday, January 16, and adjourn at 12:00 noon Saturday, is open to the public.

The conference is sponsored by the Michigan Foundation for Medical and Health Education and co-sponsored by 103 Michigan health organizations.
