ability to win over any Republicans.

Their Moody, who was appointed to the senate by Williams and then knocked out of the seat by Potter, may have a go at it. Phil Hart, federal district attorney, former corporate and state commissioner and once candidate for secretary of state, is a good man to watch. George J. Burke, Jr., also is moving steadily upward in Democratic circles. Burke recently was reappointed chairman of the liquor control commission.

The entire question is purely speculative, but that's what is buzzing around the capital these days. At least it makes for interesting conversation.

Michigan isn't the only state to spend more than its income. According to the Tax Foundation, a New York organization, 27 states in the U. S. are busily engaged right now in deficit spending. But Michigan was first and has remained most persistent. In 1945 Michigan was the only state with a deficit. By 1948 15 states were running in the red. And this state is the only one continuously operating with a deficit the last seven years.

Encouraging: Some 21 per cent more women entered nurse's training in Michigan, 1952 as compared to 1951. This set a post-war enrollment peak of 1,674 women.

General A. P. Decker (R-Deerfield) who recently made headlines when he announced his intention of sponsoring a bill banning the sale of the revised version of the Bible in Michigan, has been swamped with letters urging him to carry on his announced plan. Decker still is exploring the legal barriers to the bill.
