found possible, would save another \$190,000.

There is also a proposal in the mill to expand the liquor control commission from a three-man to a five-man group and eliminate the present two hearing examiners. Present complaint is that after the examiners hear a case, the licensee immediately appeals to the commission and the commissioners must hear it anyway. Licensees would prefer a plan where they would have their hearings conducted by members of the commission. It would at least save a lot of time on appeals.

Now Senator Blomdy has introduced a resolution asking that no new liquor licenses be issued until a replacement for Commissioner Kozarek is appointed and approved. Says it would "just open the door to blackmail."

Incidentally, there are 400 SDD licenses open in the state. Also, there are 460 applicants.

But the issuance of the liquor take-out permits won't be as simple as just weeding out 60 applicants. The legislature will get into the act.

With the liquor control commission they always do.

EXPERTS ADVISE EATING ADEQUATE BREAKFAST

An adequate breakfast has a basic pattern that includes fruit, cereal, milk, toast or muffins and butter or margarine. DETROIT DOCTOR ADVISES CARE TO AVOID COLDS

Colds are prevalent as is customary this time of year, Dr. Joseph G. Molner, commissioner of health, remarks. This is one of the three peak periods of the year when colds and respiratory infections usually occur. The other two are early fall and again in March or April.

It is well worth your while to take all possible precautions to avoid colds and to take care of yourself if you get one, Dr. Molner advises. Colds are dangerous chiefly because the causative agent lowers the resistance of the breathing passages to germs such as the streptococcus and pneumococcus which are often present. That is why a cold so often precedes pneumonia or a sinus or ear infection.

Colds spread rapidly because most people are susceptible and few people with colds isolate themselves. Children less than 5 years old are most likely to be affected. Dr. Molner suggests the following precautions for avoiding colds:

1. Whenever possible, stay away from people who have colds.
2. Get plenty of rest.
3. Wash your hands before eating or handling food.
4. Eat meals that are well balanced.
5. Avoid over-fatigue.
6. Get enough sleep to wake refreshed.
7. Dress according to the weather. Wear light clothing when doing hard work and keep extra clothes ready to put on when you are inactive.

When you catch a cold, it is usually milder and ends quicker if you take good care of yourself from the beginning. Get as much rest as you can. Keep comfortably warm and dry, and if you must go outdoors dress suitably for the weather. Eat simple, easily digested foods. Drink plenty of liquids—especially water and citrus fruits.

Consult your doctor if you have chills, fever and aching or if the cold is more than usually severe. Medicines, including antibiotics, should be taken only under the physician's direction. Even those which relieve discomfort may be harmful if used without the doctor's advice.
