Teacher Staff Cuts Considered

The 13 "pink slips" approved for some Farmington teachers may yet be rescinded if the school board approves program improvements urged for the coming year, according to Supt. Martinus Van Ameyde.

The school board recently approved giving notice to 13 teachers they would not be rehired next year because of a declining school enrollment.

The notices, required by the teachers' contract, will probably not mean the individuals notified will lose their jobs. The district normally has about 50 teachers resign for one reason or another during the year, according to Van Ameyde.

It does mean the district plans to reduce the staff to account for approximately 400 fewer pupils expected next fall.

"This is the first year we have predicted a drop in enrollment," Van Ameyde said, adding last year the district was projecting an increase but ended up with a decrease.

School administrators are

urging the money saved by the drop be used to improve the program, which would mean no cuts at all, Van Ameyde said.

The board of education is currently considering the suggested improvements.

Whether or not the enrichment could be funded depends partly on the state aid allotment for the district, which isn't usually known until the middle of the next school year.

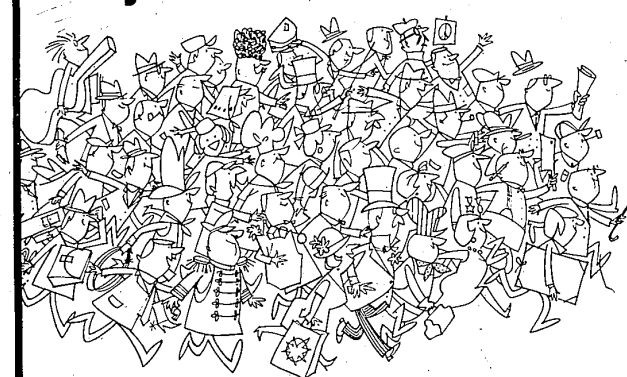
