CONSERVATION COM. SETS POLICY FOR

Conservation department em ployees now know where the stand regarding outside employ

The conservation department, in a recent meating The conservation department, in a recent meeting in Lansing, authorized a policy for outside employment of department personniel designed to judge each case on its merits. In general, commissioners agree that employees had the right to outside employment, especially in some of the lower-salaried positions.

"We recognize the employee's right," states the policy, "to engage in outside activities which do not interfere with department jobs or reflect unfavorably upon

do not interfere with department, jobs or reflect unfavorably upon the department."

After-March 1s, at which date the policy becomes effective, any employee having outside employment must receive permission from his immediate superior. In most cases this will mean simple approval. In marginal cases, the request may have to go through chânnels as far as Director Gerald Eddy for approval. If at any point the employee is rotused the right to take the outside work, he has the right to appeal to the next higher authority. The state police department operates under a similar system. 
