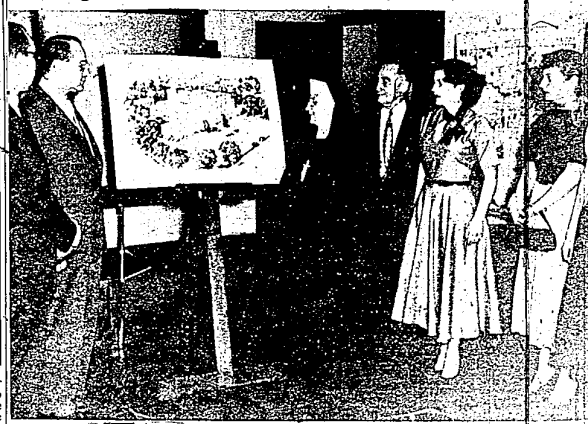

RESOLUTION
REVISING SCHEDULE 1
OF ORDINANCE C-23-48 KNOWN AS THE 1953 ZONING ORDINANCE
THE CITY OF FARMINGTON
RESOLVES:

A. That the present Section 1 of Schedule 1 to Ordinance C-23-48, "NO PARKING AT ANY TIME IN THE FOLLOWING DESIGNATED AREAS" be and the same is hereby amended to read:

1. South side of Grand River Avenue from least curb of Farmington Road to least designated "Bus Stop".

B. That a new sub-section be known as Section 1 to be added to Ordinance C-23-48 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

On the west side of Farmington Road in front of building known as the Town Hall, located at 23715 Farmington Road, between signs designated "No Parking, Building Entrance".

Passed by the Council of the City of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, at a Regular Meeting of said Council held February 16, 1953.

ORDINANCE
AMENDING SECTION 55 OF ARTICLE IV OF ORDINANCE NUMBER C-23-48 KNOWN AS THE 1953 ZONING ORDINANCE
THE CITY OF FARMINGTON
ORDAINS:

That Section 55 (b) 1, of Article IV of Ordinance C-23-48 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Twenty-five (25) miles per hour on an streets in business districts; twenty-five (25) miles per hour on all streets in residential areas; and twenty-five (25) miles per hour in public parks, unless a different speed is fixed by the City Council and duly posted, except that no person shall drive any motor vehicle truck on Shilavasse Road between Orchard Lake Road and the eastern line of the City Limits at a speed greater than ten (10) miles per hour.

This amendment to said Ordinance was introduced at a Regular Meeting of the Council of the City of Farmington on February 16, 1953, and will be taken up for final consideration and enactment at the Regular Meeting of said Council on March 2, 1953.

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PUBLIC HEALTH TO BE DISCUSSED AT U-M MARCH 26

Does your community have a public health problem? If so, a meeting at the University of Michigan School of Public Health March 25 - 26 should help solve the difficulty.

Designed specifically for the average person and not the expert, the "Citizens' Public Health Conference" is sponsored by the University and numerous citizens' and state organizations.

It is a unique attempt in the state to provide citizen layman's level a fund of information aimed toward a betterment of Michigan's public health situation.

To help achieve this goal, there will be only three speakers at the gathering. The majority of the time will be devoted to group discussion.

The speakers will be: Marjorie Barker, director of women's activities for the Michigan Farm Bureau, Lansing; Dr. Albert E. Heustis, commissioner of the Michigan Department of Health, Lansing; and Professor Paul Bagwell, Michigan State College.

Howard R. Estes of Birmingham, chairman of the public health committee of the State House of Representatives, was conference planning chairman, and will preside at the general meetings.

Additional information may be obtained from H. E. Miller, director of continued education at the School of Public Health.
