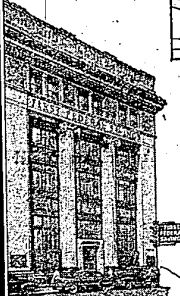
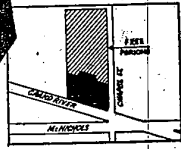

## HEDLEY HEPWORTH TO GIVE ASSEMBLY OF IMPERSONATIONS

M. Hedley Hepworth, British actor and one of the foremost authorities on Charles Dickens, will present dramatic impersonations of Dickens' characters to students of Farmington High tomorrow, March 20.

Mr. Hepworth appeared before the International Conference of the Dickens Fellowship in England and was highly acclaimed. In Paris, he gave a complete Dickens' program, for the Association des Professeurs de Langues Vivantes de la Seine.

For his school program Mr. Hepworth will include selections from other famous writers as well as Dickens.

During the war Mr. Hepworth worked for the British Secret Service impersonating a British stevedore, touring the pubs to find out if sailors and others were talking out of turn about war secrets.

From Dickens, Hepworth portrays such well-known figures as Micawber, Uriah Heep, Sydney Carton and Scrooge.
