Record Budget

Listed in the proposed budget is general property taxes amounting to an estimated \$44,580. Other taxes, including Michigan Sales Tax, amount to \$29,250. Police Department revenues are estimated at \$43,750 and water and sewer department income at \$32,200. In addition to the regular receipts, a special section has been set up for anticipated bond issues. These include: general obligation bonds for the proposed sewage disposal plant of \$200,000, revenue bonds for the extension of water and sewer lines of \$60,000, and special assessment bonds of \$6,000.

General government expenses are estimated at \$31,854. Expenses in the Public Works Department are estimated at \$45,171; Police Department at \$34,444 and Water and Sewer Department at \$22,945. These are the three principal expenditures. Under capital outlay a total of \$16,250 is estimated. This includes \$3,500 for the City Meter contract, \$3,000 contingent fund for a new fire truck, and \$5,500 for new water and sewer mains.

The bulk of the discussion centered around salaries of the various employees. The City Manager and City Attorney, who were present at the meeting, left the room during the discussion. In the case of the City Manager's salary, no figure was set up in the original proposal. The Council set the City Manager's salary at \$6,500, the City Treasurer's at \$4,200 and the City Clerk's at \$2,920. The Superintendent of Public Works' salary was set at \$4,200 with the Chief of Police's salary at approximately the same amount and the City Attorney's at \$4,400. The City Planning Commission was granted \$2,000 for the possible hiring of a professional planner.

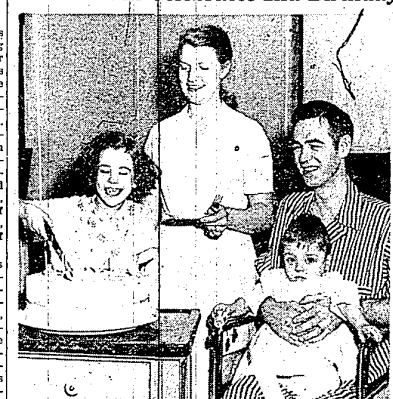
