

Vet Info Service At Madonna

The Madonna College admissions office is opening a veterans telephone referral service to provide ex-servicemen in western Wayne County information on GI Bill benefits, education, job counseling and assistance with social and other problems.

By dialing one central information number, 425-8000, Ext. 15, veterans will be able to determine which of more than 27 agencies can help with their specific problems. In addition to telephone numbers, a description will be given as to the type of services rendered by the various agencies.

Randal Hoyer, Madonna College veterans counselor, said, "The hotline service is not meant to take the place of authorized counseling or referral services. It is intended only as a clearing center for incoming calls. Inquiries will be directed to the appropriate agencies."

The Madonna service will be available to veterans or their families from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday.

"We are concerned with providing a community service to all veterans," Hoyer said, "especially to those who are interested in attending college."

Pharmacies Aid WSU

Pharmacies in Southfield, Redford Township, and Garden City are participating in a pharmacy clerkship program in cooperation with the Wayne State University pharmacy school.

Participating are the Providence Hospital pharmacy in Southfield, Tri - Medico Prescription and Supply in Garden City, and Kingsboro Pharmacy in Redford Township.

The intention of the program is for students to learn the practical aspects of their profession by spending 12 hours a week outside the classroom in local hospitals, community pharmacies, drug abuse centers, diagnostic labs, extended care facilities, and community health agencies.

"The idea of the program is to have the student involved with the patient in the real world," says Frederick Kamienny, WSU pharmacy instructor.

The program was established at the urging of the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy two years ago.


