

We'd like to talk with you about some beef fer yer home freezer or fer a locker. Now fer a few days we have some U. S. Choice beef we thought you might be interested in. Here's the dope. You can git a side of this beef fer 44c a lb. If a side is too much how about a quarter of a beef? There's a front quarter fer jest 41c a lb. or a hind quarter fer 54c a lb. All these prices are plus processing — which means the cutting, wrapping and sharp freezing of the meat. If yer interested in freezin' some asparagus too we have all local home-grown asparagus now. It's jest 25c a lb. and if you would want a big gob of it we can git it for you fresh cut in the morning and you can pick it up and fix it and have it in the freezer by afternoon. It'll taste awful good next winter, doncha think?

To pick up the odds and ends of our week end specials there'll be a 5 lb. bag of Robin Hood flour fer 39c. That's a good low figger, don't you think? Then we're glad to tell you we finally got some of our own coffee back on the shelf. Think it was shipped to us by way of Timbuktu — but it finally got here and you can git a lb. of it fer 79c this week end. One of the odds of the odds and ends is a 2 quart jar of dill pickles. Can you imagine gettin' a 2 quart jar of kosher dills fer 49c? You can do it down here this week. Lastly we got some Salad Bowl Salad Dressing fer jest 39c a quart. With the salad season sneakin' closer every day it won't take long to use up a quart of dressin' so you might as well grab take long to use up a quart of dressin' so you might as wen grab off some while it costs so cheap.
