Oakland Citizens League Sets Date For Mass Community Planning Meet

Reasons why inter-community planning of water supply, sewage drainage, schools and even garbage disposal are required were outlined this week by Joseph D. Severy, Ferndale, president of the Oakland Citizens League, in explaining why the League is sponsoring a public mass meeting at the Birmingham Community House May 28 on area-wide problems.

"Cooperation of governmental officials, business leaders and citizens is required to solve inter-community problems," Mr. Severy said. "Too often, communities are interested only in their own problems. We feel that a non-partisan organization, functioning on a county level instead of a local one, such as the Oakland Citizens League, can do much to bring together interested groups and aid in settling problems too big for any one community."

"Industry has spread rapidly into Oakland County. We have become a growing, thriving suburban area. We must take pride and plan for even further expansion. Just one community development, such as the opening of the J. L. Hudson

Dondero To Fill Academy Posts

Congressman George A. Dondero announces that the 18th Congressional District of Michigan, which is composed of Oakland County, will be given a vacancy at the United States Military Academy at West Point and one at the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis, Maryland, for the classes of 1954. Entrance at these Academies is about July 1 of that year.

Any young man who resides in Oakland County who wishes to compete in a civil service examination for designation should contact Congressman Dondero immediately. If such applicant meets the requirements of the Departments of the Army and Navy, he will be allowed to take the examination and be given the appointment provided he obtains a high enough rating in the civil service examination and is able to pass a preliminary physical examination.

The competitive examination for designation will be held on July 15, 1953; but all requirements must be approved by Congressman Dondero before June 4, 1953.

Persons interested should write the Congressman immediately if interested in an appointment to West Point or Annapolis for the class entering in 1954.

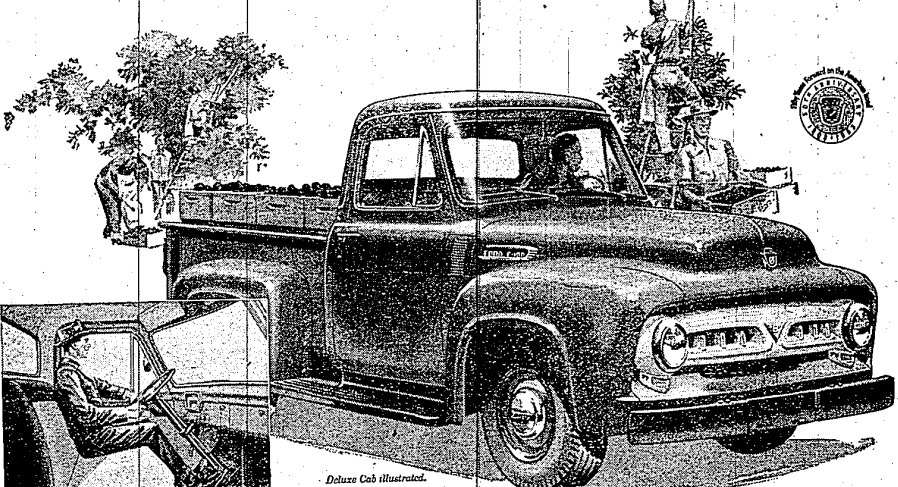
