have considerable bearing on the Board's recommendations.

The Zoning Board has held several meetings to study and discuss the proposed amendments. The first proposal pertains to the depths of front yards in commercial and industrial zones as well as requiring that exterior walls of industrial buildings be of fireproof construction. The second amendment would allow the use of trailers on farms for the housing of the owner or his employees. The third proposal would permit the erection of multiple dwellings in the township provided they meet the minimum requirements as to size and area of building as prescribed in the amendment.

The fourth proposal would bring that portion of Section 8 in the northwest section of the township, now unzoned, under the provisions of the ordinance. These new areas would be placed in Residential Zone IV. The fifth amendment concerns the rezoning from residential to commercial of a portion of the Anshut Hotel's property on Grand River between Oxford and Colfax Streets.

est was water. The group also filed a petition with the Board outlining their requests. The Board accepted the petition and placed it on file with the provision that they would investigate the situation and have a report at the next meeting.

IN ANSWER to the question regarding the existence of an unoccupied house near the intersection of Fink and Hawthorne Streets, Archie Leonard, Township Attorney, expressed the opinion that no action could be taken to have the building removed or completed. He added that both the local and county health officers and inspected the house and ruled that it did not constitute a health hazard. The building, which is owned by Doubleday Wallace, was moved onto the property prior to the passage of the zoning ordinance. The matter was brought to the attention of the Board several weeks ago by a group of residents in the area.

The Board authorized the County Drain Commission to expend in excess of \$600 for the cleaning of the Hazel Drain which runs between Farmington and Southfield Townships. According to the provisions of the resolution, if the cost exceeds \$600 or 40% of the original cost of the drain, the District will be re-assessed. The Board also moved that if there is not sufficient money in the County Drain revolving fund the township will advance \$3,500 to the Commission if Southfield Township advances an equal amount. The money would be returned to the township when the assessment money is received.

The monthly general meeting of the Farmington W.S.C.S. will be held at the church at 1:00 p.m. on June 2. Mrs. Edgar Cope will be in charge of the program. On Sunday, May 31, during the regular morning service, the new officers of the society will be installed.
