DRIVERS LICENSE BUREAU RESUMES OPERATION

The Farmington Driver's License Bureau was re-opened Thursday morning after a one-day shut down on verbal orders from the Michigan State Police.

Mayor Kenneth Loomis stated this week that the Bureau was closed temporarily in order to clear up procedure on non-resident licenses. The Mayor stated that under the new set-up, records must be kept on all licenses issued to residents outside of the city and copies sent to the Oakland County Sheriff's Office and the County Board of Auditors.

Loomis emphasized that the change will not affect the service. All persons formerly eligible to secure a license at the Farmington bureau will continue to apply locally.

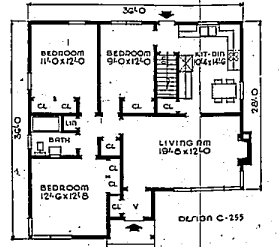

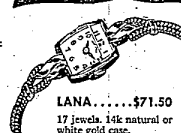

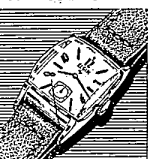
