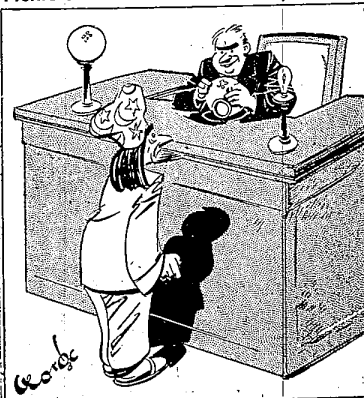

Dick Site Survey Made By Government

Michigan's "wet-lands" are being surveyed this month as part of a continent-wide study of water breeding habitat, the conservation department reports.

The work is being done in cooperation with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

The study is to gather specific information concerning all lake, marsh and other water areas where ducks nest.

The Fish and Wildlife Service has set up a standard procedure for evaluation for the wet lands, hoping to overcome confusion caused by the many individual state methods of tabulation formerly used.

It continues to say, "I speak and speak — to Washington."

"Well, what are you going to do?" said a Congressman friend as we sat in his office. He put his hand on a stack of mail. "These are from influential people in my state. They've got a good argument for the air base, the dam and the other federal spending projects they're writing about. But so has everyone else who writes or comes here, and yet we in Washington who have studied these projects, and weighed them in the light of the overwhelming demands on the nation's financial resources in these days of crisis, are convinced that we must start making drastic reductions somewhere."

"Will you be able to do it?" I asked. "I'm afraid not," he replied thoughtfully. "At least not to the necessary extent — unless public opinion can make itself heard in Washington above the demands of the groups who are clamoring here asking special consideration for all the things we're trying to economize on. There simply cannot be any genuine economies without a lot of groups and a lot of individuals having to make a small sacrifice in the national interest — in the interest of their own long-range personal welfare."

Are you a part of public opinion? Are you being heard in Washington? Or don't you pay taxes?

SPRING MATING RITUALS OF GAME BIRDS OBSERVED BY CONSERVATION FIELD MEN

All across the state these spring mornings, certain of Michigan's game birds are busy enticing the females of their species with colorful dances and noises.

Sharp-tailed grouse, for example, gather each morning on about the same grounds as they have used each year in the past to dance and circle before one another, challenging competition of other males while the females look on from a short distance.

Prairie chickens go through similar rituals to attract the fair sex.

Ruffed grouse are more solitary in their exhibitions. A lone male chooses a log or stump to stand on and then beats his wings rapidly against the air, making noise somewhat like an outboard motor.

So intent are the birds on their dancing and so careful in choosing about the same "dancing grounds" as used the year before, that conservation department photographers and observers, secure in blinds, are able to watch the shows from a few feet away.

Populations of the birds may also be estimated and trends checked by counts made at the various dancing grounds in the state, most of which are located in the upper and northern lower peninsulas.
