man, who recently served as president of the American Bar Association, has been conducting a personal crusade to awaken our citizens to the danger of "Treaty 1" through the United Nations, and to rally support to the Bricker Amendment.

"Unless this vast program of treaty-making is brought under proper limits by a proposed constitutional amendment," Mr. Holman says, "American rights, both state and individual, and the American form of government, will be substantially altered, if not destroyed. When the great problem of world peace is looked at from all sides, the necessity for preserving America's identity, integrity and strength becomes more and more apparent and one is impelled to the conclusion that a strong, independent and free America is not only the best for its own citizens, but the best guaranty of world peace and world order."

That is a sound conclusion.

To Use More Fish In School Lunch Plan

A broader use of fish in Michigan's school lunch program will be emphasized this fall when two workers from the Fish and Wildlife Service start a series of cookery demonstrations in schools, the conservation department reports.

The two specialists will demonstrate six laboratory tested recipes to cooks, managers and home economists in schools around the state.

Easy availability, lower prices and high nutritive values of fish meals makes them a natural for the lunch program, according to one of the workers. Demonstrations will start when schools reopen in the fall.

State Plants Million Trees, Shrubs In Forest Projects This Spring

Close to one million trees and shrubs have been planted on state game and recreation areas in southern Michigan this spring, the conservation department reports.

The plantings were made under the department's habitat development program.

About half the plantings were conifers, while the remainder were shrubs and hardwood trees.

The program was started in 1946 with the aid of federal Pittman - Robertson funds. Since then, nearly seven million trees and shrubs have been planted.

Also, to the end of 1952, about 2,500 brush-piles had been established.
