## HOME AGENT ADVISES CLEAN-UP OF STEAM - PRESSURE CANNER NOW

It's not too soon to begin getting your steam-pressure canner in condition for the coming canning season, reminds Mrs. Josephine Lawyer, Oakland County home demonstration agent.

"For safe operation of your canner, you will need to clean the pet-cock and safety valve openings by drawing strings or narrow strips of cloth through them. Do this at the beginning of the season and often while the canner is in use during the season.

An accurate pressure gauge is necessary to get the processing temperatures needed to make food keep, advised Mrs. Lawyer. While a weighted gauge needs only to be cleaned thoroughly, a dial gauge, old or new, should be checked before the canning season begins and also during the season if you use the canner often. Ask your dealer where to get the dial gauge checked. Better still, return the gauge to the manufacturer for checking.

Wash the canner thoroughly, but don't put the cover in water; wipe it with a soapy cloth and rinse with a damp, clean cloth and dry well.

For a boiling water-bath canner, a big, clean vessel will do. If it is deep enough to have an inch or two of water over the

## CLOTHES SPECIALIST OFFERS HINTS ON RE-STYLING

Are you harboring out-of-date clothes in your closet that you cannot bear to discard? Lola Belle Green, Michigan State College clothing specialist, asks this question with good reason. She has some suggestions for re-styling clothes.

First you should get a good idea of the current fashions, Miss Green believes. Then start your re-styling on the dresses best adapted to the fashion since it will take less time or money. Re-styling may be just a matter of a new belt—like the wide cinch belts being worn now—or just a new set of buttons or a fresh white plique collar.

But if there are things wrong with the basic line of the dress you will have to do some ripping out and cutting. For instance, dresses or suits more than two years old tell their age by the shoulder ending. Today little if any padding is used in shoulders. Miss Green advises ripping out the padding and inserting a smaller pad. The arm and shoulder may have to be reconstructed. Perhaps, however, your dress would be pretty and practical without any sleeves. Then you could have a jumper by day and a dressy frock for evening wear.

Miss Green suggests adding length to a dress by putting in a piece of material that would not show under a wide belt. A midriff section of contrasting fabric above the waistline will give the new empire line and needed length in the blouse. Conceal a skirt yoke with one of the new midriff or over blouses.

## Make Your Own Syrup For Canning Fruits

To make a sugar syrup for sweetening fruit you are canning, boil sugar and water or fruit juice for five minutes and remove the scum, advises Michigan State College home economists.

A heavy syrup can be made by using a cup of sugar with one cup of water or juice. A medium syrup recipe calls for a cup of sugar with two cups of water or juice and a light syrup will come from three cups of fluid with one cup of sugar.

## 1952 Fire Loss In State Hits Record Figure

Michigan's fire losses rose to a new high in 1952 when property valued at \$35,600,412.26 was destroyed. There were 193 fire fatalities, including 66 children and one fireman.

The information is contained in the annual fire loss report compiled by the State Police fire marshal division. The report is based on summaries submitted by fire departments throughout Michigan.

State Police Commissioner Joseph A. Childs, who is also state fire marshal, pointed out that the 1952 monetary loss exceeded the previous high of \$23,740,609.38. The fire fatality toll, however, was below the previous three years. The all-time high was 257 deaths in 1948.

More fires were reported by local departments than in any other year. There were 64,225 as compared to the previous high of 59,958 in 1948.

## LEGAL NOTICES

**ORDINANCE 10-A**  
AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE USE OF WATER FROM THE WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM OF FARMINGTON TOWNSHIP

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON

Section 1. Whenever the Township Board of the Township of Farmington has been notified by the Board of Water Commissioners of the City of Detroit that the demand for water from the Detroit Distribution System is such that unless the users is regulated the public health, safety and general welfare is likely to be endangered, the Township Board shall make rules and regulations, not less restrictive than those required by the City of Detroit, to regulate the water usage in the Township of Farmington during such emergency.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to violate any such rule and regulation. Provided that before any such rule and/or regulation shall become effective it shall be approved by resolution of the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, and then published in one issue of a newspaper of general circulation in the Township of Farmington.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be effective June 10 to September 5, inclusive, each year until rescinded.

Section 4. Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be fined not more than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 6. This ordinance is declared necessary for the preservation of the peace, health, safety and welfare of the people of the Township of Farmington, and hereby given immediate effect.

**YOUR BOARD OF WATER COMMISSIONERS**

wants you to know that in spite of the facts that basic water demand is considerably greater than last year and that the additional production facilities now under construction will not be completed before the summer, prohibiting sprinkling have been reduced from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. as was in effect last year, to 2:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. This relaxation of restrictions has been made possible because two new boost stations will be put into operation this summer. While it is possible that conditions may develop which will require greater restriction of water usage, it is believed that by complete adherence to the below stated restrictions by all users of the Detroit Water System, peak demands can be met throughout the summer. For the benefit of all concerned, your cooperation is earnestly requested.

## OFFICIAL NOTICE

Lawn Sprinkling Rules and Regulations Amended to Provide As Follows:

1. Effective June 10, 1953, lawn sprinkling is prohibited in the City of Detroit between the hours of 2:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

2. Mechanical refrigeration systems used for cooling purposes for human comfort, and cooling city water, not recirculated, shall be limited to an average space temperature of not less than 80 degrees F. dry bulb when the outside temperature is 50 degrees F. or above by official U. S. Weather Bureau determination. Provided this shall not apply to hospitals or similar institutions, shall it apply on Sundays. Exceptions to this rule may be made by the Board of Water Commissioners for good and sufficient reasons to be shown by the applicant.

3. Water use by suburban communities using Detroit water is to be curtailed by restrictions at least equal to those of the City of Detroit.

## STATE RENEWS 4-H GIRLS' PROGRAMS IN BAKING, DRESSES

Two national 4-H award programs of special interest to girls have been approved for 1953 by the State Extension Service. They are Bread Demonstration and the Dress Revue.

Objectives of the demonstration program are to help 4-H Club girls acquire the skills involved in making breads, rolls and other baked food. Participants learn to give effective demonstrations showing some phase of what has been learned and its relation to the family dietary. Incentive for outstanding 4-H records of achievement, provided by Standard Brands, Inc., comprise medals of honor for top ranking individual and team participants in each qualifying county. 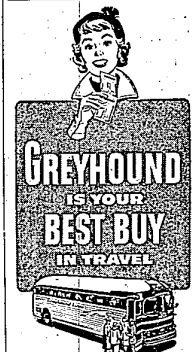
