Oakland County Personnel To Head Newly Acquired Camp At Lafer Farm

Announcement has just been made that the Lafer Farm, an Oakland County show place for about 50 years, owned by the Lafer family of Detroit and the home of the well known Lafer dairy herd, has been acquired by a group of Oakland County and Detroit people to be used for a boys' home and camp for underprivileged children and youth. The farm consists of over 300 acres located about one mile south of Oxford and a short distance east of the Orion - Oxford Road. It has a fine private lake with good swimming facilities, and excellent camping sites and grounds. There are fine buildings including the large main brick house as well as a good sized farm house and large barns. The herd of 37 registered Holsteins is included in the sale.

The project will be under the supervision of James Hunt, director, and Judge Arthur E. Moore of the Probate Court, and will be operated by members of the Juvenile Court Staff. Mr. Hunt, who has operated a camp for approximately 150 children each summer for the last five

State Plans To Sell Tornado-Damaged Trees

The 10,000 trees knocked down in Lapeer state game area during a tornado recently will be cut up, sold, or otherwise disposed of as quickly as possible, the conservation department reports.

The conservation commission, in its regular June session last week, gave department director Gerald E. Eddy authority to dispose of the timber in the best manner possible.

About one-quarter of a million board feet of timber was flattened during the storm. The 500 acres damaged in the 3,000-acre game area included pine, oak, elm and poplar and represented some of the finest timber in the area.

The timber must be removed quickly to avoid a fire hazard.

City Of Detroit And Pipeline Company In Dispute

As a result of the dispute between the Lakehead pipeline company and the City of Detroit, Gerald Eddy, conservation department director, recently asked the attorney general for a ruling on legislation permitting the company to work in Michigan.

The "enabling legislation" au-

thorized the company to lay pipeline 500 miles across Michigan to service the Sarnia plants opposite Port Huron on the St. Clair River. The department has been approving easements across state-owned land under terms of the legislation.

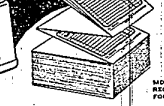
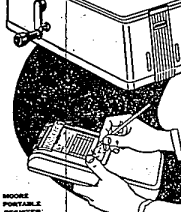
Detroit asked that easements

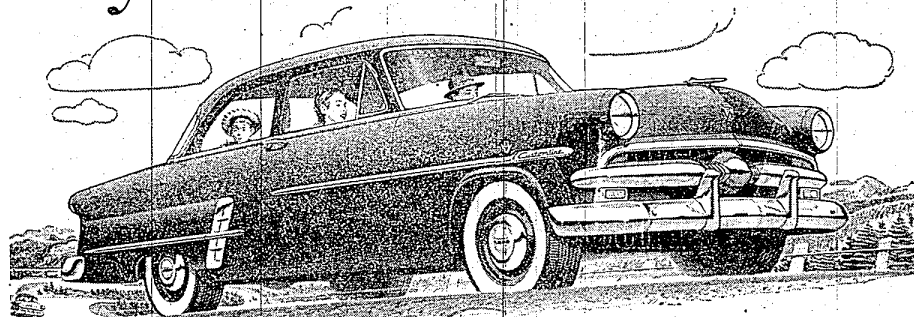
