Cubs Win First; Tigers Bite Yanks

The Star Cutter Cubs won their first start of the season on Tuesday of last week as they defeated the Farmington State Bank Tigers, 7-3.

Bob Hug was the winning pitcher and had a no-hitter until the last inning when Al LeSage singled through short-stop. Thompson walked and Ed Fulton's long double to center scored both runners. Fulton scored on an error to account for the third Tiger marker of the inning but Hug then settled down to fan the next three hitters.

Gary McLean got credit for the win, although he shared the mound duties with Ron Byron and Chuck Thomson. This trio held the game Yankee sluggers to three hits as the Tigers made it two straight over the milkmen.

RAINBOW TROUT POPULATION DOWN, REPORTS STATE

Field reports from conservation officers and fish division workers indicate that spring running rainbow trout populations are down from previous years, the conservation department reports.

Conservation officers, talking to hundreds of fishermen, reported some streams producing better than formerly, but in general noted the catch was below that of a few years ago.

Department lifting operations at Homestead dam on the Betts River, at Tippecanoe on the Manistee and at state weirs on the Black and the Little Branch of the Au Gres show a slump in the number of fish lifted over the dam for spawning.

Fisheries workers are doubtful about why the slump has occurred, though poaching and the sea lamprey have in the past both played their part in lessening populations of the fish. This year, however, few trout have appeared bearing lamprey scars and indications are that poaching in 1953 has been down from previous years.

State Fire Records Remain Above Par.

No forest fires were reported in the upper peninsula last week, the conservation department notes, the first time since the winter break-up that a fire-free week has been recorded.

The southern lower peninsula came near matching the UP's mark; only two fires, burning three acres, were reported during the week.

In the northern lower peninsula, 12 fires burned 21 acres, again very low for a week of fire protection.

F.A.R.C. Reports Record Year

The Farmington Area Recreation Commission is doing a land-liside business. At the end of the first week some 2,173 half-days of participation, an increase of almost 900 over the previous year, were reported by the Commission.

Swimming was the most popular activity, averaging 124 youngsters per day. It was necessary to add a second bus to the program, and then a third was necessary.

Same Ruling Applies On Non-Resident Licenses

Temporary non-resident fishing licenses issued in Michigan this summer will be valid only ten days, as in the past, the conservation department notes.

In May, Governor Williams signed a bill increasing the length of temporary non-resident fishing licenses from ten to 15 days, but the law does not take effect until October 2, ninety days after the legislature adjourns.

no avail. Hunters have methodically torn down the signs.

Basically, I believe Farmington Township has become too heavily populated to safely permit hunting. Moreover, it is not the local residents to whom most of us object, but the great influx from the nearby metropolitan area. Farmington is the first stop for the once-a-year hunters after they leave Detroit and they descend upon us in droves.

Those who have attempted to enforce the present laws against trespassing and unlawful hunting have all too often found them inadequate and difficult to enforce. You don't argue with a man with a gun in his hand. Mr. Howard Estes, who introduced the bill in Lansing, pointed out that it was not until West Bloomfield Township, where he resides, was closed to hunting that the problem was effectively met.

There were pheasants and rabbits in the northwest section of Detroit where we formerly lived, but surely no good sportsman would contend that hunting be permitted in the City of Detroit simply because it would be more convenient to hunt near home.
