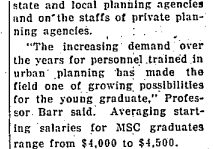

Prof. Charles W. Barr, a leader in developing the program at MSC, reports that unusual employment opportunities exist in federal, state and local planning agencies and on the staffs of private planning agencies.

"The increasing demand over the years for personnel trained in urban planning has made the field one of growing possibilities for the young graduate," Professor Barr said. Averaging starting salaries for MSC graduates range from \$4,000 to \$4,500.

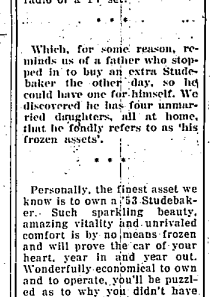
