WILT DISEASE DANGEROUS TO OAK SURVIVAL

Oak wilt disease has placed the mighty oak tree in serious danger in Michigan.

That's the warning from Forrest Strong of the Michigan State College botany and plant pathology department. The disease was first recognized in Illinois, Iowa and Wisconsin in 1929, and since that time more than 50 per cent of the oak trees in many woodlands in those states have been destroyed. The disease is not that prevalent in Michigan, however.

Strong believes that better ways of controlling oak wilt will be found, but he now advises owners to cut down infected trees as soon as they are found in a woodland. The saw logs should be removed at once and piled in a dry, sunny location. They also can be taken to the mill and sawed at once into lumber. Once a tree is infected by the oak wilt fungus, warns Strong, it dies, usually in a short time. He suggests calling the local county agent when oak wilt is suspected.

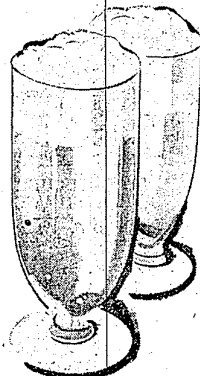
(Continued from Page Two) and help of these people to smear and to isolate any person who was hurting Communists."

Smear Their Enemies
Dr. Dodd testified: "There is absolutely no doubt in my mind that anyone in America who dares to buck the Communist conspiracy is going to receive very rough treatment from Communists, who learn how, unfortunately, to utilize many unsuspecting people who think they are supporting freedom of thought but who in reality are the best protections for the Communist conspiracy."

The actual Communist smear artists are to be found in all the media of national communications, Dr. Dodd said. "The Party has representatives, for instance, in the press, representatives in the magazine world, in the radio world. If everyone in concentrating upon one particular person, you get the cumulative effect of a party working on many different levels."

"The important fact is that not many American citizens understand the workings of this widespread, powerful, undermining conspiracy. Ask your Congressmen for the Judiciary Committee reports on 'Subversive Influence in the Educational Process.'"

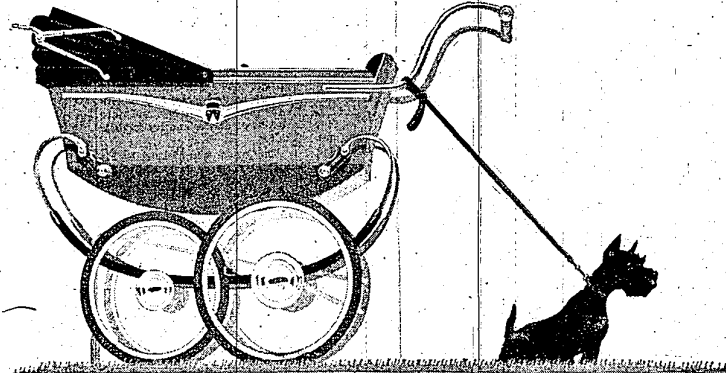
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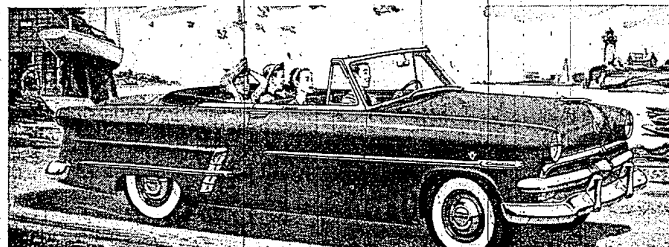


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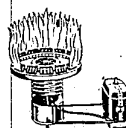
