ON THE FARMINGTON HILLS CHARTER

Vote NO Because:

- I. Operating taxes will immediately increase--ultimately to almost three times present operating millage:
 - a) Proposed charter provides for ceiling of 10 mills.
 - b) A city income tax may be adopted by Council, safeguarded only by veto of the people's petition for referendum initiated within the limited time provided by State law and the proposed Charter.
- II. Provision for Council salary increases are in violation of State law.
- III. Homeowners will still pay at least 80% of costs for paving streets adjacent to their property.
- IV. The proposed charter is deficient:
 - a) There are no adequate safeguards against excessive salaries of non-elected officials.
 - b) Advance Notice of important actions, including passage of ordinances, is absent.
 - c) City manager's authority is unduly limited.
 - d) Representation on Council for each affected area is not assured.
- V. Initiative requirements are too stringent and too cumbersome.
- VI. The referendum provisions are impractical and unworkable.
- VII. Road maintenance and construction costs will skyrocket. Tremendous expense will be incurred in purchasing road equipment, machinery and buildings. All City residents may be compelled to pay a portion of the cost of road improvements throughout the City. Special assessment districts may be created by the Council by resolution from which there is no appeal.
- VIII. Our Township is financially in the black--most cities are financially in the red.
- IX. Annexation claims are overexaggerated.
