### MUNICIPAL JUDGE HAS HANDLED TOTAL OF 30,845 CASES

Municipal Judge John J. Schulte, Jr., disclosed this week that, since becoming a Justice in Farmington on April 6, 1956, he has tried 30,845 civil cases and a total of 20,165 criminal and state cases.  
Judge Schulte also stated that he has tried 1456 criminal cases under city ordinances and 157 cases under the Southfield Township Ordinances - for an overall total of 20,415 cases.  
The judge has had only one case where the decision was reversed upon appeal. He also stated that one criminal case which was handled by a jury trial and won here was thrown out by the prosecutor upon appeal.

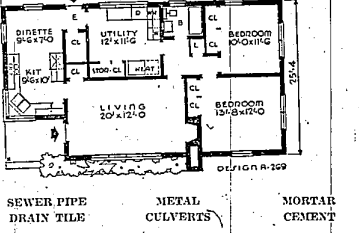

contract obligations in the district as of July 1. According to figures presented, \$1,377,206.96 has been paid on building contracts awarded in the total amount of \$1,586,204.20. This would leave a total of \$208,997.24 to be paid on contracts awarded thus far.  
The School Board voted to set salaries for the individual members at the same figure as last year. Under the scale the Board secretary receives \$300 per year, the president \$125, treasurer \$125, and each of the two trustees \$50.  
The Board also voted to retain the services of the school auditor, Mrs. Hazel B. Leland, and increased her salary from \$65 to \$70 per month.

four were taken to Pontiac General Hospital.  
Earlier in the week Mark Lloyd Carney of Beverly, New Jersey, died after admission to Redford Receiving Hospital following an accident in which his car was struck by one driven by Percy W. Owens of Plymouth. The accident took place on U.S. 16 at Twelve Mile Road on July 9.  
Owens, who allegedly was attempting to pass another car when he hit the car driven by Carney head-on, received chest injuries and lacerations in the crash. Carney was a student at Michigan State College.  
Nathaniel Hill and his wife Lucille, of 10560 Dancers Court, Ferndale, were taken to Redford Receiving Hospital as a result of injuries received in an accident on U.S. 16 near Meadowbrook on Sunday at approximately 12:40 p.m. Hill received a possible fracture of the left hip and his wife's left arm was injured.  
Hill's car was struck by a vehicle driven by Gerald Stewart of 20532 Tuck Road. According to police reports, Stewart was traveling east on U.S. 16 when he attempted to pass another car and when the car he was overtaking also pulled out, Stewart skidded into Hill's vehicle.  
Stanislav Cieslak of 22515 Tulane in Farmington received lacerations of the left leg when he reportedly walked into the side of a vehicle driven by James C. Greene on Grand River near Pearl Street. The accident occurred at approximately 6:40 p.m. Sunday.

### SIX MINORS FINED BY JUDGE SCHULTE FOR DRINKING SPREE

Farmington City Police arrested six minors over the week end for possession of intoxicants and Municipal Judge John J. Schulte, Jr., fined the offenders \$25 each.  
They were discovered in automobiles by police officers and all were from the area of Brighton.  
In other court action, Judge Schulte sentenced Talver Avery of 7329 Beaumont Street, Detroit, on two counts, that of driving while under the influence of liquor and for driving without a license.  
Avery received a fine of \$125 or 60 days on the first count and 30 days on the second. He was arrested by city police officers while driving on Grand River near Wilmarth Street in Farmington.  
Avery's driver's license had been revoked by Detroit's Traffic Judge Murphy some time ago. After his release from the Oakland County Jail when the above-mentioned fine is served, Avery will be held on two counts by the Detroit City Police.
