Methods Help Fever Victims

Hay Fever Sufferers Offered Three Hints

There may be more to hay fever than a brief period of sneezing and watery eyes, a University of Michigan allergy specialist says.

Hay fever may start a chain reaction of allergy to such things as dust and food, states Dr. Kenneth P. Matthews, assistant professor of internal medicine at the U-M, who adds that from 35 to 40 per cent of hay fever sufferers eventually develop bronchial asthma, a much more serious disease.

There are some medicines given to the pollen and fungus that the hay fever problem varies with geographical area, the individual and the season. The most common type will begin in Michigan August 15, when the ragweed starts to pollinate, and will run until late September.

This year, physicians will continue to use three time-tested methods of dealing with allergy, Dr. Matthews explains.

Hypersensitization, or injection of pollen extracts in gradually increasing amounts, builds up the individual's tolerance for a particular pollen. This method is particularly helpful, and an aver-

aging of the cause of the patient's trouble and reverses the tendency for the allergic state to become more severe.

Certain drugs may give temporary relief. Antihistamines frequently are helpful, and an over-increasing number of these compounds are now available to suit individual preferences.

The third method of combating allergies is to avoid the offending substances. Though this is relatively simple in the case of sensitivities to such things as animals and foods, pollen avoidance is not easy.

A few simple "don'ts" may help. One should not hike through the countryside, and it is best to drive with the car windows closed. Weather permitting, keeping the bedroom windows closed at all times also may help. Although beautiful flowers are insect-pollinated and therefore are not major causes of hay fever, working in the garden or other close contact with cultivated flowers may cause trouble.

If the situation gets completely out of hand, Dr. Matthews advises, escape to another part of the country or states where the offending pollens or mold spores are absent. This will give great temporary relief.

VA to RENEW GI INSURANCE AUTOMATICALLY

Four million veterans with GI term insurance in force will no longer have to apply to Veterans Administration for renewal of their policies for another 5-year term before their old policies expire.

VA said it will do this for them automatically if their old policies are not lapsed at the expiration of the term period. This means the policy must be in force at the end of the term period with the final premium having been timely paid. The new procedure went into effect July 23, 1953, when the President signed Public Law 148. It will save at least \$600,000 a year in administrative costs. The new law covers only those term policies that expire on or after July 23, 1953. VA said it cannot be applied retroactively to term policies which expired before that date.

Approximately 270,000 World War I and World War II term policies are expected to be renewed automatically under the new law during fiscal year 1954.

Although the law also provides for automatic renewal for the more recent post-Korea term policies, none of these is scheduled to expire during fiscal year 1954 because they have not been in force long enough.

Once the automatic renewal is affected, the veteran has a new 5-year term policy on which he must pay the increased premiums timely if he wishes to be covered a year longer. If he misses any premium payments, including the first renewal premium, he may re-instate the policy at any time before the end of the term period under the usual reinstatement procedures.

Methods Help Fever Victims

Hay Fever Sufferers Offered Three Hints

There may be more to hay fever than a brief period of sneezing and watery eyes, a University of Michigan allergy specialist says.

Hay fever may start a chain reaction of allergy to such things as dust and food, states Dr. Kenneth P. Matthews, assistant professor of internal medicine at the U-M, who adds that from 35 to 40 per cent of hay fever sufferers eventually develop bronchial asthma, a much more serious disease.

There are some medicines given to the pollen and fungus that the hay fever problem varies with geographical area, the individual and the season. The most common type will begin in Michigan August 15, when the ragweed starts to pollinate, and will run until late September.

This year, physicians will continue to use three time-tested methods of dealing with allergy, Dr. Matthews explains.

Hypersensitization, or injection of pollen extracts in gradually increasing amounts, builds up the individual's tolerance for a particular pollen. This method is particularly helpful, and an aver-

aging of the cause of the patient's trouble and reverses the tendency for the allergic state to become more severe.

Certain drugs may give temporary relief. Antihistamines frequently are helpful, and an over-increasing number of these compounds are now available to suit individual preferences.

The third method of combating allergies is to avoid the offending substances. Though this is relatively simple in the case of sensitivities to such things as animals and foods, pollen avoidance is not easy.
