In price of cigarettes, each tax-deductible shipment caught finances lots of others which might go untaxed.
It costs \$2 cents to collect \$100. Commissioner Nims is proud of Michigan's low collection rate. It was \$1.77 in 1940 when he started work and it declined more or less steadily ever since. "Most states work on a two or three per cent basis," he explained.
The present staff consists of 600 people compared to 460 when the department was organized.



PLANS UNDER WAY FOR HOSPITAL IN LIVONIA

Plans to build a 100-bed Livonia General Hospital (Osteopathic) were announced this week with Mayor Jesse Ziegler listed as a member of the board of trustees. The hospital was formed as a non-profit corporation last April by interested citizens.
Fund raising plans and selection of a suitable site are now under consideration.
Appointments have been made to a five-member executive board and an 11-member board of trustees.
Members of the executive board are Dr. O. L. Brooker, president; Dr. John F. Vos, vice-president; Douglas Campbell, recording secretary; Clarence Hoffman, treasurer; and Nettie Carey, corresponding secretary.
Trustees designated for three-year terms are Mayor Ziegler, Carl A. Peterson of Plymouth; Howard Warner of Farmington; and Gerald K. Johnson of Detroit.
Trustees designated for two-year terms are William Brashear of Livonia; Fred C. Weinert of Livonia; James H. Hinkley of Plymouth; and Vance Kefgen of Farmington.
Trustees designated for one-year terms are Charlie L. Cook of Livonia; Sam Spicer, of Plymouth; and Nettie Carey, of Livonia.
Weinert is chairman of the fund-raising committee, and Kefgen heads the site and land acquisition committee.
The Clarenceville Optimist Club has announced full support to the hospital project.
