1. When approaching the crest of a grade or upon a curve in the street, road or highway where the driver's view is obstructed with in such distance as to create a hazard in the event another vehicle might approach from the opposite direction.

2. When the view is obstructed upon approaching within 100 feet of any bridge, viaduct or tymnel.

The foregoing limitations set forth in sub-paragraph (b) shall not apply upon a one-way street, road or highway.
