New necklines, fine detailing and unusual trim mark the new designs, all of them in colors ranging from pastels through the deep and vivid tones.

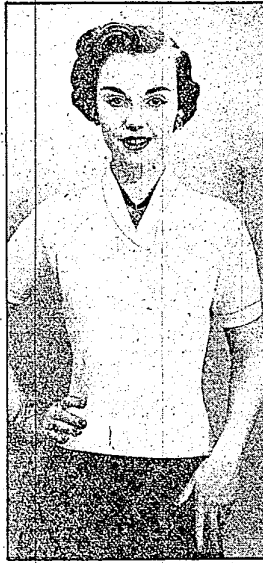
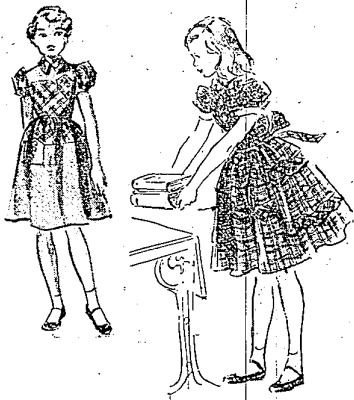
