Well, traffic piled up, but Tiny paid no heed. Light changed


green three times. After the kit-ten had enough, Tiny waved the traffic through.



INCREASE YIELD ABOVE AVERAGE FOR EACH ACRE

Mehigan farmers could abuble their profit margins on wheat by increasing yields per acer from the state average to the top possible output per acer, reports the Middle West Sell Improvement Committee, in a statement made public in Chicagor recently. Michigan wheat yields can be obsetted from the present 1 deyear state average of 24.7, bushels per acre to about 50 bushels per acer according to information compilet by agricomolists.

according to information compiled by agronomists.

"In the production of every acr' of wheat, there is a basic bost of about \$30," says the statement 'At \$2' per bushet this would leave \$10 net profit per acre at 20 bushel yield levels.

farms without the use of fertilizer.




