GOODWILL TRUCKS TO MAKE PICK-UP IN FARMINGTON AREA OCTOBER 5

Goodwill Industries pick-up trucks will be in Farmington on Monday, October 5, to collect usable household discards to provide jobs and training for the 400 physically handicapped men and women employed in the Goodwill Workshops in Detroit. Contributions of materials to the rehabilitation program may be made by phoning Miss Lora Ault at Farmington 1461-M.

Miss Ault is employed by Goodwill as its local telephone representative in keeping with the organization's policy of giving employment to handicapped people. Last year's party dress, outgrown clothing, a broken doll or an unused table when sent to Goodwill Industries will help provide a job with wages and training for disabled adults. Clothing, shoes, toys, hats, small appliances, furniture and other household items are the raw materials which were used to provide jobs paying over a half-million dollars to handicapped men and women during 1952.

In order to make "Not Charity but a Chance" a reality to a greater number of physically handicapped persons this year, Goodwill Industries is asking for greater contributions than ever before from the housewives of Farmington.

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

September 22, 1953
A Special Meeting of the City Council of the City of Farmington was held September 22, 1953, for the purpose of considering the construction of a water main on Gill Road to connect the Grand River and Oakland Avenue water mains.

Meeting was called to order at 4:56 p.m. by Mayor Loomis.
Roll Call: Cavanaugh, Conroy, Lindbert, Loomis and Nourjian. All Present.
Reasons for construction were stated as follows:

1. Improve pressure conditions at the extremes of the existing mains.
2. To permit circulation of water, thereby providing a more palatable water supply in the area concerned.
3. To provide discharge facilities for proposed pumping facilities on Lots 19 and 20 of Perkins & Cowan's Subdivision.
4. To provide water supply for residential lots on east side of Gill Road between Oakland and Grand River Avenues.

Motion by Lindbert supported by Cavanaugh that the City Manager be authorized to proceed as soon as possible to construct a six inch Transit water main with the necessary control valves and hydrants between Grand River Avenue and Oakland Avenue on Gill Road at an estimated cost not to exceed \$3,000.00. Motion carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Lindbert and supported by Conroy that the meeting be adjourned.

LEROY H. TOWER TRAINS WITH NAVY IN ATLANTIC

More than 70 Atlantic Fleet ships are taking part in NATO exercise Mariner, one of the largest naval operations ever staged in peacetime.

Among the men participating in the exercise is Leroy H. Tower, fireman, USN, of 21652 Hamilton, aboard the oiler USS Elokomin.

Designed to provide realistic training, Mariner pits two opposing forces against each other in air, surface and undersea operations.

Units of the Atlantic Fleet are operating from Norfolk, Va., north almost to the Arctic Circle and east to the British Isles.

U. S. units will be employed on both sides. Opposing forces are receiving training in submarine and anti-submarine warfare, amphibious and underway operations, convoy, aircraft strike and patrol missions.

The exercise will end October 5.

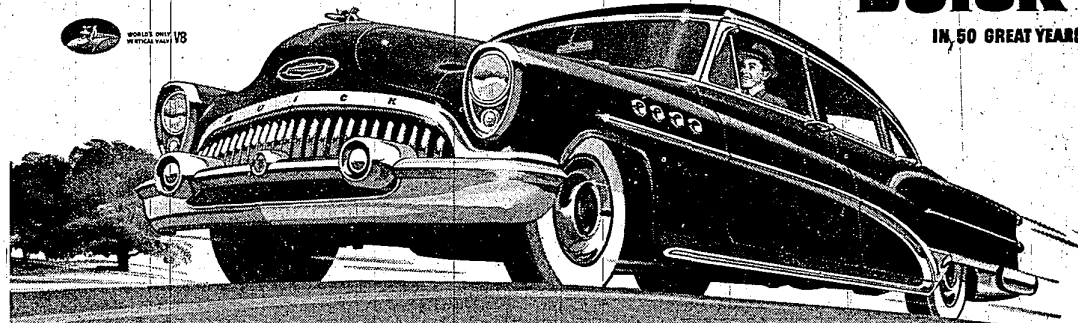
