

# FALCONS BOW TO ROCHESTER, 26-6; TROJANS OVERTAKE MILFORD FOR SECOND TIE

## Gilmore Stars For Clarenceville; Falcons Lack Winning Drive

The Clarenceville Trojans battled the Milford Indians to a 7-7 tie last Friday, September 25, for the Trojan's second tie in as many games.

The game started with Ed Gilmore kicking off to the Milford 21 yard line and it was returned to the 35. After running three plays from scrimmage the Indians were forced to punt. When the Trojans took over they started a drive for the goal which ended on the Milford nine yard marker as the Nelson Todd stepped out of the end zone to catch a pass from quarterback Glenn Reed. The Indians then took over on downs. The rest of the first period and all the second period remained a scoreless see-saw battle with most of the play done in Milford's territory.

In the second half Gilmore again kicked off to the Indians. After receiving the ball the Indians worked a couple of ground plays and then after a long pass play which moved the ball to the Trojan 29 yard stripe, Dave Winterhalter, the Indians' left halfback, ran off tackle and went all the way for the touchdown. Don Cotgrove added the extra point which made the score Milford 7 - Clarenceville 0.

Early in the fourth quarter the Trojans started to march again, but this time all the way. Ed Gilmore swept left end from the Trojans for the first Trojan score of the year. The extra point was added by Gilmore who again swept left end and made the score Clarenceville 7, Milford 7.

Neither team could score in the remaining eight minutes.

The next game is with the Northville Mustangs on the Clarenceville gridiron at 3:30 p.m. Friday, October 2.

Only three teams on the University of Detroit's 1953 ten game schedule hold an all-time edge over the Titans. They are Villanova, Marquette and Houston.

## GAME OF WEEK FEATURES OHIO- CALIFORNIA, OCT. 3

National football prestige will be at stake in Memorial Stadium at Berkeley, California, Saturday, afternoon, October 3, when the Golden Bears of California play host to Ohio State's Buckeyes in the TV Game of the Week to be televised nationally over the 53-station NDC network.

With Coach Lynn Waldorf's gridders battling to retain the mantle of Pacific Coast champion and the Buckeyes of Coach Woody Hayes rated among the favorites in the Big Ten conference race, Saturday's game truly will be the "Game of the Week."

The national telecast will start at 1:45 p.m. (PST) and the game will be televised starting at 2:00 p.m. (PST).

Saturday's game will give the nation's football fans an idea of what to expect when the Pacific Coast Big Ten representatives clash in the 1954 Rose Bowl Game next January 1 as both teams are contenders for the Rose Bowl bid.

The California - Ohio State game will be the third of the NCAA-approved schedule of 13 TV Game of the Week Telecasts.

The University of Detroit football team has not lost a season since 1938, and since 1949 the Titans have been beaten only twice in opening games.

## Trojan Cross Country Team Bows To Milford

Clarenceville's cross-country team suffered another defeat on Friday, September 25, when Milford beat them 12 - 29. The meet was held at Clarenceville and was run off at half time of the football game. Clarenceville ran four boys consisting of Louie Dorris, John Ferris, Ken Jacobson and Duane Roy. They placed as follows: Roy, third; Ferris, 6; Jacobson, 9; and Dorris, 11.

The winning time was 11:38. Roy's time was 12:02. The next time the Trojan Thincleds run will be Friday, October 2, at Keego Harbor.

A week earlier, Clarenceville attended a triangular cross-country meet with Bentley and Plymouth at Riverside Park. The boys ran two miles. Of the 25 boys running from the three schools, Clarenceville contributed four. They were Louie Dorris, John Ferris, Kenneth Jacobson and Duane Roy. Roy placed fourth; Ferris, 9; Jacobson, 11; and Dorris, 19.

The Trojans placed second in the meet. The winning time was 11:58. Roy's time was 12:17.

The two touchdowns scored in one game by Bob Burzmaier for the University of Detroit against North Dakota State were more than he scored all of last year when he counted for one six-point or.
