

FARMINGTON TRAFFIC COURT JOINS STATE SAFETY COMMISSION PROGRAM

Judge John J. Schulte today announced that his traffic court is cooperating with the Michigan State Safety Commission on the September Child Safety-Watch Out For Kids program.

As a forceful reminder to motorists that they must drive, especially carefully near schools during the September when the children have just returned from vacation and are not used to going safely to and from school, Judge Schulte stated that motorists convicted of speeding or any other serious violation near schools during the school hours should expect to pay a higher than average traffic fine.

According to the Judge every motorist who has qualified for a driver's license has a responsibility to exercise special caution when driving near children or in areas where children are likely to be found. A motorist who fails to accept such responsibility and jeopardizes the lives of children should not continue to retain the privilege of having a driver's license, the Judge added.

Judge Schulte warned motorists to be on the alert for small children who run out from between parked cars since this is the most common error a small child makes in traffic. Blame the child, its parents, or the school is not substitute for the adult driver accepting the responsibility of "Watching Out For Kids"; the Judge concluded.

Livonia Mothers Form Patrol

A campaign by the City Traffic Commission to make Livonia streets safer for school children is getting results.

An immediate accomplishment is the formation of a "Mother Patrol" to escort pupils of Livonia Center elementary school across Five Mile Road at Sirrey.

The crossing was one of three designated as "dangerous" by a group of approximately thirty-five mothers who held two meetings last week to organize the "Mother Patrol".

Their sessions were the outgrowth of an earlier traffic commission meeting attended by representatives of more than twenty civic and parent-teacher organizations.

At that time, Commission Chairman Jack Hixox emphasized the importance of the school safety problem and asked for the cooperation of the various groups.

The first result was the action of the mothers whose children attend Livonia Center school. They formed the "Mother Patrol" and made plans to organize two more.

The additional "Mother Patrols" are expected to be in operation soon on Farmington Road in front of St. Paul's Lutheran Church and on Five Mile Road at Westmore.

Mrs. William Clark, 15651 Strawn, provided her home for the first meeting of the Livonia Center mothers. The discussion was led by Mrs. Kenneth Driver, Mrs. Gordon Eadie and Mrs. Jack Hixox.

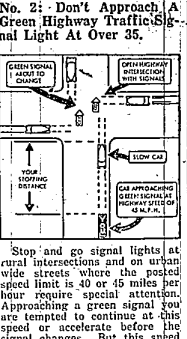
At a subsequent outdoor meeting held in the Coventry Gardens lot, the mothers conferred with Joe Melton, sixth grade teacher at Livonia Center, who heads the school safety patrol organization.

Melton told the mothers that the safety patrol boys, who already were manning the three dangerous crossings, would give full cooperation to the "Mother Patrols".

The mothers then drew up a plan for their "Mother Patrol" at Five Mile and Sirrey.

They said they considered their action only a "stop-gap measure," pending formulation of a plan by city and school authorities to appoint permanent adult supervisors at the crossings.

The mothers lauded the cooperation of St. Paul's Lutheran Church and two merchants, Clarence Jahn and Walter Neilson, who permitted school children to use a safe route through their
