Road To Health:

Sewage when exposed on the surface of the ground can be a source of human disease. Yet it is almost with indifference that some property owners and home owners permit this unsanitary practice to continue in and around their homes, jeopardizing the health and welfare of their family and neighbors.

Within the past few months there have been a great number of cases of infectious hepatitis, diarrhea and dysentery. Many of these cases were investigated by the health nurse and sanitarian and found to be caused by the improper disposal of the by-products of human life.

Sewage is considered to be all waste discharges from the home, which include kitchen and laundry wastes. Each home provided with water under pressure should also be provided with a septic tank of adequate size with sufficient field to keep the sewage underground.

The size of the septic tank is determined by the volume of water used in the home for all purposes. The minimum size septic tank permitted by the Farmington Township health code is of 500 gallon capacity with a tile field of at least 200 linear feet.

Anyone planning to install or alter his sewage disposal system is strongly urged to contact the Farmington Township sanitarian, or the Oakland County Health Department. The advice and information received may well mean a saving of time, trouble, and money.

Until the community can provide itself with much needed sewerage and a sewage disposal plant, it is left to each home to be responsible for the safe disposal of sewage.

AVOID COLDS BY OBSERVING EASY RULES

The increase in colds which usually comes with the first chilly days is again apparent this fall. Although absences from school and work are not higher than usual for this season, Dr. Joseph G. Molner, Detroit commissioner of health, reports.

He says, the one way to catch a cold is to come in contact with someone who has one. A cold is the most common kind of respiratory infection and although the cause has not yet been fully determined, physicians in general believe that it is due to one or more viruses.

The fellow with a cold is the most dangerous to others around him in the first hours of his infection, often while he is still wondering if he is "coming down with a cold." He continues to be a source of danger for about three or four days. Colds spread rapidly because most people are susceptible and few persons who have a cold isolate themselves from other people.

A cold may seem little more than a nuisance but its real importance is in the complications which may follow. Some of these lead to chronic diseases such as sinus infection or ear infection.

Workers and school children have no practical means of entirely escaping colds. They cannot isolate themselves. Invalids, frail, elderly people and young children should be kept away from everyone who has a cold.

You can help to avoid catching cold and spreading respiratory diseases by doing these things:

1. Avoid people who cough or sneeze carefully whenever you can.

2. Keep your finger away from your mouth.

3. Wash your hands before eating and after using the toilet.

4. Wash dishes and eating utensils in hot, soapy water and scald them with boiling water.

5. Avoid getting over-tired, over-eaten or chilled.

6. Dress according to the weather.

7. Build up your resistance by healthful habits of living.

8. See your physician if a cold hangs on or if you have repeated colds, and follow his advice about the use of drugs.

9. Take care to protect others from exposure to your infection. When you have a cold, cover your nose and mouth with tissue paper when you sneeze or cough. Dispose of the tissue at once.

Conduct Survey

On Immunization

A countryside survey to determine the immunization status of school children in grades kindergarten through fifth, is being conducted by the Oakland County Health Department, according to John D. Monroe, M. D., director of the Oakland County Department of Health. Cooperating with this survey are the various school systems and parent groups.

A letter will be sent home on November 16 with each child, kindergarten through fifth grade, to the parent requesting the date the child received his last immunization. The survey letter should be returned to the school not later than November 20, with the information completed.

Volunteers will tabulate this information so that the percentage of children immunized can be determined throughout the school. In order for a community to be adequately protected, at least 60% of the child population should be immunized. This 60%, evenly distributed among various age groups, brings about effective control even though occasional cases may occur.

The results of the findings of the survey will be publicized and parents of children who are not adequately immunized will be urged to complete their children's immunization needs.
