NEW VOCAL MUSIC TEACHERS JOIN FARMINGTON STAFF

Two part-time instructors have been appointed by the Farmington Board of Education to take over the vocal music classes left without an instructor by the November 4 resignation of Warren Henderson.

Mrs. Keith Willoughby, who is well-known in Farmington music circles and who has served Farmington schools in the past as a substitute teacher, has taken over the morning classes, which include the Girls' Glee Club. Mrs. Willoughby serves as choir director of the Episcopal Church in Farmington.

Other vocal music classes have been taken over by David Murray, Jr., of Ann Arbor. Murray is a voice major working for his Master's degree at the University of Michigan.

Originally from Birmingham, the new instructor now resides in Ann Arbor with his wife. He will be graduated in June and expects to teach voice and chorus in college next fall.

Although he has recently arrived at Farmington High, Murray has stated that he is pleased with the capabilities of the chorus and he expects to introduce new music to the group in the future.

Murray has had substantial experience in conducting and has been active in the Gilbert and Sullivan Society at the University.

Michigan Produces 52% Of Lakes States Veneer

Michigan produced 52 per cent of veneer logs removed from the Lakes States woodlands during 1952, the conservation department report.

But the Lakes States, including Minnesota and Wisconsin, produced only 78 million board feet of the logs during the year.

That total was 10 per cent less than 1950 and 33 per cent less than 1948.

Veneer logs are taken from the older, larger trees and are generally of high quality.

Most important species was maple with birch running second.

NEW FRENCH FILM SET FOR NOV. 24 AT ART INSTITUTE

Man's outlook for the future is strikingly dramatized in the French film, "Life Begins Tomorrow", to be shown free of charge at the Detroit Institute of Arts Auditorium Tuesday evening, November 24, at 8:00 p.m.

An extraordinary group of French filmmakers, headed by the artist, Andre Gide, the writer, Jean-Paul Sartre, philosopher, Jean Rostand, biologist, and Le Corbusier, architect - discuss art and science for an "average man" portrayed by Jean-Pierre Aumont. This is the movie's premier showing in Detroit.

Tickets are available one week in advance at the Publications Desk in the Art Institute lobby. If space is left in the 1200-seat auditorium at 8:00 p.m., those without tickets will be admitted.

Written and directed by Nicole Vedres, "Life Begins Tomorrow" examines the responsibilities of people today in preparing the world of tomorrow.

Sartre explains the philosophy of Existentialism and maintains that everyone who accepts the responsibility of a scientifically bred race of supermen, illustrating with fascinating laboratory shots.

The architect, Le Corbusier, emphasizes man's need for light and greenery with his new Radiant City apartment building near Marseilles. The late literary great Andre Gide speaks amusingly of the vital role of mass communications.

Though the artist Picasso is silent, intimate views of him at work and play illustrate the joy of living.

English subtitles accompany the picture. This is the third on the Art Institute's current "Films as an Art" series arranged by Elizabeth H. Payne.

REORT 12% BOOST IN ENROLLMENT AT CLARENCVILLE

Completion of the latest enrollment report shows total membership in the Clarencville School District to be up 12.1% over the same period a year ago.

This represents an increase of 204 students in all grades. A breakdown of the figures shows an 11.9% increase in the elementary schools and a 12.5% increase in the junior - senior high school. At the present time there are 1,194 students enrolled in the elementary grades, including kindergarten. The junior - senior high school enrollment now stands at 693 students.

Children's Aid Society Meets

The November meeting of the Board of Directors of the Michigan Children's Aid Society was held at the Waldron Hotel in Pontiac at noon, November 13.

Mrs. Barney Habel reported on the recent meeting of the State Board of Trustees of the Michigan Children's Aid Society which she attended in Lansing. Plans were made for a Christmas party to be given by the staff to be held on Friday, December 11. Mrs. Leola Lewis was made chairman of the committee.

Miss Endelman, executive secretary of the Michigan Children's Aid Society, reported on the activities for the month advising that the case load is up considerably from the previous month and requests for service keep coming in. At the present time there are 97 children in care and eight new children were admitted so far this month. These children are all from broken home situations where parents need help temporarily while working out their problems and making permanent plans for the children. The mother of two little children went to the TB Sanatorium. Another mother of two children deserted, leaving the father to plan for them. In the case of two other children the father deserted, leaving the mother without resources. Two other children were cared for while the mother had an operation. One child of an unwed mother was admitted for adoption placement.

ington Township would be paid for by the School District. No action on the water extension has been taken by the Board as yet. A similar approval was secured earlier from the City of Farmington. Fees have also been made on the property for the possible development of a shallow well.

A motion was approved by the Board setting up a 50-50 arrangement with Hall C. Hancock and the Uhlir - Murphy Insurance Agencies for the handling of all fire and vandalism policies covering buildings and equipment in the school district.
