

Staff Evangelist Plans Crusade

Jerle Brubaker, staff evangelist from Lancaster (Pa.) Bible College, will conduct a youth crusade this month in Covenant Community Church, 28800 Student (one block north of Five Mile and Beech - Daly), Redford Township.

The crusade will begin at 11 a.m. Sunday, May 20. There will also be a Sunday evening meeting at 7, and weeknight services at 7:30 p.m. through Thursday, May 24. A rally is scheduled for the last meeting.

Brubaker conducts youth crusades for the purpose of reaching teens and parents. His messages and programs are geared to help answer, in a practical and Biblical way, parents' frustrations and teenagers' concerns.

He began his ministry at the age of 10 under the influence of Child Evangelism Fellowship. When he was a teenager, he won the first

Religion Update

In 1960, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (Mormons) had a membership of 1.6 million. As of the first of this year, membership in 78 countries has doubled to 3.2 million.

This spectacular growth is due to a number of amazing things, not the least of which is the denomination's annual general conference here. This really isn't a conference at all, because it is totally devoid of conferring.

Nobody ever questions the maintenance of this self-perpetuating hierarchy which runs things with an impressive and unchallenged precision that would make old Vatican hands weep with envy.

Nobody ever asks for a full financial report of what may well be the nation's most enormous church treasury. And the canny first presidency and quorum of the Twelve Apostles keep the rank and file saints apparently satisfied and dazzled with spectacular buildings.

Currently there is a \$30 million office building opening here to house the Mormon headquarters offices, with \$15 million more allocated for a similar building in Manhattan, as well as another \$18 million for a new temple in Silver Spring, near Washington D.C.

Far from providing any time for discussion or (God forbid) dissent, the Mormon General Conference consists entirely of 6,000 extremely clean-cut and wholesome people of all ages in what, for the late 20th century, is

the well, high unbelievable activity of sitting for three days to hear addresses by three dozen elderly men.

Similarly miraculous is the fact that these Mormon leaders, men of genius in business affairs and ecclesiastical recruitment, are, with one or two exceptions, capable of delivering thoroughly prosaic and theologically puerile messages.

Considering the fact that the LDS Church is now tied with the Episcopalians as the nation's fourth largest denomination, these speeches are as dreadful as if the late John F. Kennedy had his inaugural address ghost-written by Art Linkletter and Edgar Wright.

This seems to bother the earnest assemblage and one who, it may even be more Mormon genius. For 4,000 of the 6,000 in the capacity tabernacle congregation (with thousands more waiting in line outside) are bishops and stake presidents. They would probably be satisfied if President Harold B. Lee, a well-groomed and congenial man with an impressive voice, were to decide to test their

obedience by a verbatim reading of 10 pages of the Salt Lake City telephone directory.

For each one of these secularily employed minor prelates is aware that this power structure may someday elevate him to the top LDS chairs. And this will mean that he too may speak to an international TV-radio audience as well as to a live congregation of 6,000 attentive people who hang upon his every word - even though he may not have the slightest forensic or literary skill or experience.

What's more, his message, however purgatorial it may be to the listeners will be backdropped by something quite evidently out of Paradise: 400 voices, which no less a musician than Eugene Ormandy has described as the greatest choir in the world.

In how many other denominations can a businessman counteract the often painful or even lethal job of retirement by (1) being elevated to a group which has absolute control over the accumulation and spending of perhaps billions of dollars and (2) having one's words broadcast annually over 300 radio and TV stations, accompanied by the Mormon Tabernacle Choir?

Every member of this absolutely angelic choral group is a volunteer - as is another LDS group's 17,000 missionaries!

Would it all the speakers at general conference were not so drastic a contrast.
