estimate for the proposed system. AS 800X as the final plans can be completed, the city will begin advertising for bids on the construction. Although the Hays campaign holds the patent on the system, the work is sub-contracted with the construction under the supervision of company engineers.

James Tennant, City Manager, stated that the city has a stand-by offer for the sale of the necessary bonds to finance the project. The bond sale will be conducted on a bid basis with the assistance of a consulting agency. However, if no bids are received, the stand-by offer will be accepted, thus the city has assurance of selling the bonds.
