GOODWILL TRUCK TO MAKE PICK-UP ON JANUARY 4

More handicapped people are employed at Goodwill Industries today than at any time since its founding in Detroit 23 years ago, according to Harold H. McKinnon, executive secretary. "This is only made possible through home discards of toys, clothes, small appliances and furnishings which have been made so wholeheartedly in this district," said McKinnon.

These discards are the raw materials with which Goodwill employs work. Without them there would be no jobs and no Goodwill stores. Nearly 500 handicapped people would be unemployed.

In order to keep production at a steady flow, Goodwill must make certain discards do not drop off during any one season. One of the difficult times of the year has been during the holiday season, immediately before and after the New Year. It is a time when Goodwill is in the hands of everyone, but it is also a time when everyone is busy with extra activities.

Goodwill Industries is depending on the housewives during this period to remember to fill the Goodwill bags and call for a pick-up. The old adage "It is more blessed to give than to receive" has a special import when the gift is directed to the Goodwill Industries. The Goodwill trucks will be in Farmington and Franklin Village on Monday, January 4. For a truck pick-up call Miss Lora Ault in Farmington, 141-M or Trilinity 3-3600 in Detroit.

CHURCH GROUP WILL CONVENE AT SAGINAW

Farmington and vicinity will be represented by a delegation of 200 at the three-day Regional Convention of Jehovah's Witnesses, Saginaw, Michigan, beginning January 1.

Deloss Ludwig, presiding minister at Farmington and head of the delegation, announced this week that, in addition to the local group, delegations from 27 other congregations, including Bay City, Port Huron, Royal Oak, Pontiac, and Flint, will attend the assembly. Some 1,500 are expected to convene.
