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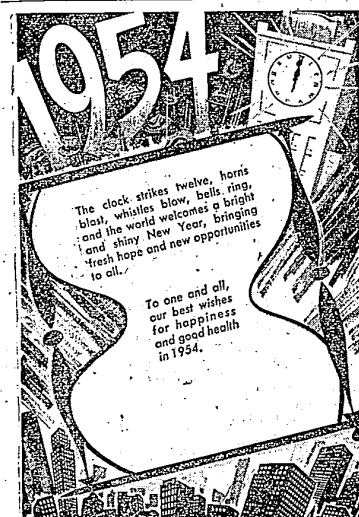

Ice Fish Derby Set For Jan. 9

Southeastern Michigan's second annual Ice Fishing Derby at the Metropolitan Beach on Lake St. Clair near Mt. Clemens is set for Saturday, January 9. Seventeen trophies will be awarded to men, women and children in this porch fishing contest.

Ideal facilities for ice fishermen make this Huron - Clinton Metropolitan Authority park the perfect spot for the sport. The beach offers free, cleared parking for 6,000 cars near Lake St. Clair and the inland water basin; a food bar serving up to 10,000 daily; a well-stocked bait and tackle shop and warm restrooms.

A fishing tackle rental plan has become effective January 1. This will enable individuals to rent necessary equipment at a nominal cost and organized groups of six to ten persons to effect even greater savings through rentals.

Making the beach popular with all the family, fishermen or not, is an acre-sized skating rink, equipped with flood lights, music and warm shelters. Located in the shelter of the administration building, the rink is connected by duck-board walks with the food bar, and it draws almost as many spectators as skaters.

PRO CAGE COACH CALLS FOR CURB ON COURT GIANTS

Height has become such a dominating factor in basketball that Al Cervi, coach of Syracuse of the National Basketball Association, believes the time has come to limit the number of big men to keep the pro game from being spoiled by the gargantuans.

Under Cervi's proposal, as reported in The Sporting News, every player on a team would be classified as to height, with the following limitation on the five permitted on the court at any one time - no more than two six feet five and over, one between 6-4 and 6-5 and the other two under 6-4.

Since each team would "fit" in the matter of height, individual skill would return to the game, Cervi asserts.

The coach, who was one of the pro league's "little men" at 5-11½ before retiring to the side lines this year, said there would be a lot more action, under his plan, "because the little man is faster, you'll have a faster game and there will be more play-making."

THREE NEW BOOKS OFFER INTEREST TO FISHERMEN

Now that hunting seasons have, for the most part, passed from the 1953 scene, sportsmen will have chance to turn to angling for a pleasant change of pace.

And for those fishermen who like to read about their sport, three new bulletins were recently made available through the conservation department's fish division at Lansing.

One, called "Fishing in Twelve Michigan Lakes Under Experimental Regulations," contains the background research results that helped bring about changes in pan fish regulations so that fishermen may now angle longer and take more fish than before.

Another concerns "Production and Harvest of Salt Fishes in Michigan," and is a detailed report of a study made on bait-type herring.

The third booklet is a long, exhaustive study of a type of burrowing mayfly and of its importance to lakes in southern Michigan. The research and writing that went into the three pamphlets was done by members of the department's institute for fisheries research at Ann Arbor.

Brer Rabbit Takes Dip To Outsmart Hunter

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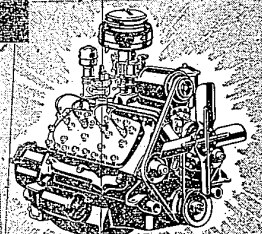
