**CITY STARTS WORK ON NEW 1954 ASSESSMENT ROLL**

Preparation of the 1954 assessment roll is now under way in the city, according to James Tennant, City Manager and assessor.

Tennant stated that the 1954 roll assessment is expected to be approximately 10% higher than last year. New residential and commercial building is largely responsible for the anticipated increase. The expected 10% increase covers both real and personal property, Tennant added.

Personal property statements and veteran exemption applications are now in the mail. Tennant stated that personal property statements should be returned to the City Assessor by February 15. Veterans' applications must be filed not later than March 1 if they are to be entered on the 1954 tax roll.

Tennant emphasized. According to the City Charter the roll must be prepared and certified on or before the first Monday in March.
