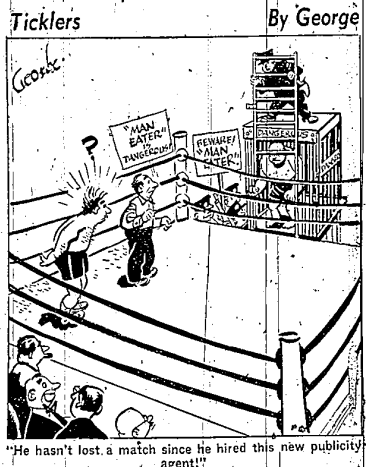
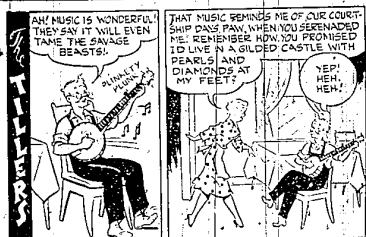




WEEKLY CROSSWORD PUZZLE

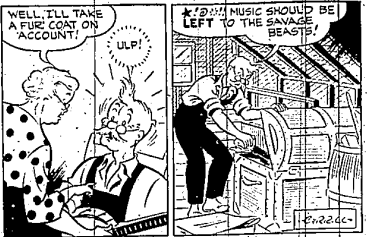

MICHIGAN PRESS ASSOCIATION SETS ANNUAL MEET DATE

The annual convention of the Michigan Press Association will be held at Michigan State College's Kellogg Center for Continuing Education on Friday and Saturday, January 29-30.

The John A. Harph, president of MPA and assistant Secretary of Defense in charge of manpower, will address the association Friday noon on "Some Dilemmas of Defense." The Friday evening dinner speaker will be Russell Griffin, Associated Press world-wide correspondent; former chief of the AP Tokyo Bureau. Mr. Griffin covered the fact - finding tour of Vice-President Richard Nixon in the Far East.

MICHIGAN HOT ROD SHOW SET FOR JAN. 8-10

Michigan Hot Rod, Sports and Custom Car and motorcycle enthusiasts will really appreciate the second annual "Automotive" show sponsored by the Michigan Hot Rod Association which will be held in the Agricultural Building at the Michigan State Fair Grounds January 8, 9 and 10.

Approximately 70 cars and motorcycles will be on display during the three day show. There will be movies pertaining to various hot rod "auto and boat racing events."

The Michigan Hot Rod Association is a non-profit organization which is composed of 15 member hot rods consisting of approximately 100 members. The group is endeavoring to raise funds through means of the show to build a "Raz strip." This is a multi-mile concrete roadway 30 to 40 feet wide. It is used for acceleration speed contests.

It is generally believed that the public and highway officials that if the Michigan Hot Rod Association is successful in raising the necessary funds to build the drag strip that over 90% of the unauthorized hot rodding will be eliminated from city streets and state highways.

The show will be open on Friday, January 8, from 5 to 10 p.m. and from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday, January 9 and 10.
