Cancer Society Offices Moved

The office of the North Oakland County branch of the American Cancer Society will move on January 4 from the present Huron Street location to a new ground floor site at 69 West Lawrence, corner of Carr Avenue in Pontiac.

In announcing the move, Dr. John B. Monroe, chairman of the local planning committee of the ACS, said the new location meets several critical needs of the organization. "We have long regretted the necessity for our volunteers and the people they serve carrying cancer dressings and other bulky equipment up and down stairs. We are happy to have found adequate facilities at ground level at last," he said.

Improved parking facilities for loading and unloading is adjacent to the new office. There will be room inside for the usual office activities, as well as ample space for parking dressings and for holding meetings. Mrs. Mildred Kingsbury, who is in charge of the North Oakland office, said an open house will be held at the new quarters soon. "We sincerely hope that the move will mean improved service to cancer patients and will attract additional volunteers to the organization," she said.

Mrs. Kingsbury said that ten boys from Over School Boy Scout Troop 23 of the Huron Valley Council volunteered to carry several hundred bundles of cancer dressings to the new quarters on Wednesday, December 30, simplifying the moving and enabling the office to serve patients without a break.

The North Oakland Branch of the Cancer Society is supported entirely by voluntary contributions, a large share coming from community chests and units throughout northern Oakland County. It provides information and sends free services to cancer patients upon request. The office telephone number is FRidley 2-6220.

DRUNK DRIVER CAMPAIGN GETS BEST RESPONSE

Cooperation in the December-January statewide traffic safety campaign aimed at reducing accidents caused by drunk drivers has been greater this year than ever before, State Police Commissioner Joseph A. Childs reports.

The campaign is sponsored by the State Safety Commission, Michigan Liquor Control Commission and the state associations of chiefs of police, sheriffs, judges and justices.

Reports are not complete enough to indicate the full impact of the program, Childs said, "but we do know we have had more enthusiasm and better cooperation than we have ever had."

At the same time, the commissioner pointed out that although the special campaign will be concluded at the end of January, the problem exists throughout the year.

State Police study of 17,000 rural accidents showed that drivers who had been drinking were guilty of a much higher percentage of speeding violations than non-drinking drivers," the commissioner said. "The drunk driver has the highest percentage of violations for driving on the wrong side of the road."

A study at Evanston, Illinois, under the auspices of the Northwestern Traffic Safety Institute and the National Safety Council, showed that drivers who had been drinking were 23 times more likely to become involved in personal injury accidents.

"The results of these studies make it evident that we must wage a continuous campaign against drunk drivers,"

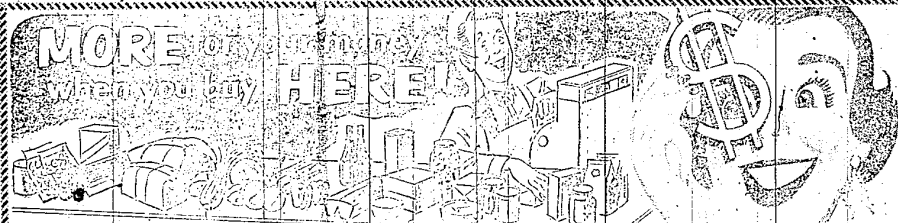
