## CELEBRATE BOY SCOUT WEEK FEBRUARY 7 - 13

Corner lot encampments, store window displays, religious award presentations, Blue-and-Gold Banquets, Old-Timer Reunions, Father and Son dinners, Courts of Honor, Scout Sabotage Services and other special programs will highlight the annual 44th birthday anniversary during the next two weeks.

Most of the celebrations will occur during official Boy Scout Week, which runs from February 7 to 13. Each of the local Council's units, including Cub Packs, Scout Troops and Explorer Units, is planning a birthday party of its own to celebrate the incorporation of Scouting into the National Charter of Scouting by Congress on June 15, 1916.

Nationally, Scouting's membership is over 3,000,000 Scouts and Leaders, by far the largest of the 17 different countries which endorse Scouting and are members of a World-wide International Scout Bureau. None of the so-called "iron curtain" countries now has Scouting -- as one of the first decrees of any totalitarian power is to banish Scouting and similar democratic and patriotic youth movements. Since 1910, more than 21,000,000 American boys and men have been identified with the Boy Scouts of America.

Alfred Schult, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. Schult, of 30321 Shady-side, Livonia, recently was promoted to corporal with the 7th Infantry Division in Korea.
