Gerald L. Lunden, a Livonia resident, has announced his candidacy for a six-year term on the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees.

Lunden, 32, has worked in the civil division of the Wayne County sheriff's office for 11 years. Previously he was administrative assistant to the commanding general of U.S. Forces in Germany.

Lunden has attended the University of Maryland, Oakland University, Oakland Community College, Mercy College and Wayne State University. He also attended U.S. Intelligence School and the Identification Systems Institute.

He has been a member of several traffic safety committees including the Detroit, Western Wayne County and downriver and governor's conference committee.

He also has been active in the Big Brother program, baseball and football programs for underprivileged children and has been advisor to the Head Start program and Boy Scouts.

"We are indeed fortunate in being the recipients of the foresight and wisdom demonstrated by those individuals who helped make Schoolcraft College a reality," Lunden said.

"At this point in time, we have the opportunity to rekindle that spirit of community service and terminate the stagnation of partisan politics that has recently threatened to cripple the board's ability to function."

Buerk To Run For SC Board

Richard G. Buerk, a Wayne-Westland School District assistant principal, has announced his candidacy for a six-year term on the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees.

Buerk, 29, has been assistant principal at Stevenson Junior High School since 1969 and previously was a social science, English and science teacher at Adams Junior High School.

He resides at 8277 Woodcrest Dr., Westland, in Livonia School District. Buerk is seeking one of three six-year terms in the June 11 election. There is also a two-year term available.

Buerk has a bachelor's degree in education from the University of Michigan and a master's degree in history from Eastern Michigan University. He also has attended a graduate seminar in history at the College of William and Mary.

He has been active in several Wayne-Westland committees including student involvement, North Central evaluation, fine arts cyclical review, curriculum council department head and grading committees.

Buerk is also a member of the Westland Library Board, Westland Symphony Committee, and Plymouth Elks, and is former secretary of the Westland Kiwanis.

"Schoolcraft Community College has the opportunity to provide meaningful alternatives to traditional approaches in meeting the educational needs and desires of people," Buerk said.

"A three-pronged thrust in the areas of career education, transfer programs and personal enrichment courses can serve as an educational catalyst for all persons in northwest Wayne County."

Ringsred Will Seek SC Term

Alfred D. Ringsred, veteran recruiter for Schoolcraft College's Center for the Education of Returning Veterans, has announced his candidacy for a six-year term on the college's board of trustees.

Ringsred, 39, is a six-year resident of Plymouth and a recent Schoolcraft graduate. He resides at 42465 Parkhurst.

He is seeking one of three six-year terms in the election. One two-year term is also available.

As a student at Schoolcraft Ringsred was active in the veterans club, a member of the college's student recruitment task force and a member of the President's Council of Presidents, the student advisory group to the college president.

Prior to attending Schoolcraft, he was an assistant analyst for American Community Mutual Insurance Co. in Plymouth for four years.

"I feel the community college is one of the most unique phenomena in education in that it creates a situation that can allow students to go on to another degree or gain a trade," Ringsred said.

"The college provides continuing education through community service programs," he said, adding that "it also provides leadership for community colleges by initiating new programs and upgrading current programs so they are the finest."

Ringsred said he dealt with administration, faculty and students as senior veteran recruiter and found a "lack of communication" among these groups.

"This lack of communication has resulted in a waste of energies and a fragmentation of efforts. These things are indicative of a non-productive atmosphere which encourages discouragement, fosters frustration, sometimes mistaken for apathy, and deprives the school of the success of even the smallest projects."

He hopes to make a contribution to bringing down barriers between the different groups if elected, he said.

Michigan State senior Miller Ken Papejoy of Gled Ely, Ill., ran the distance in 3:37.0 in a dual meet against Notre Dame in 1972 to set all-time marks for 400 MSU and Big Ten performance.
