Long Speeches Make It Hard For Substitute

The Orchard Ridge Theater Guild's presentation of "The Affairs of Anatol" Saturday evening (as part of the college's Gaslight Festival) was a real example of the old dictum, "The show must go on."

Ten days before the show, the leading man was taken ill, and Tom Cornfield, was drafted (or volunteered) to take his place.

This he did with great composure and finesse, but Anatol had a lot to say about his loves and his philosophy of living, and it wasn't possible for Cornfield to commit it all to memory.

His reading from the script threw the whole production off pace. With more time to study, this weekend should be better. (It might also be a wise idea for the director, Dr. Dan Greenberg, to cut some of his long speeches.)

"Anatol" is an interesting little play written by Arthur Schnitzler in 1893.

Taken on one level, it's a rather good comedy and a delight for girl-watchers. In looking for the perfect woman, Anatol has "encounters" with six, ranging from a circus performer to a suburban housewife. They are portrayed by Cathy Wheeler, Robin Schwartz, Carol August, Gail Nymshuck, Claudio Karbon and Cathy Baum.

At another level, mostly through conversations with his friend, Max (played by Mike Sochaki), we can ponder the psychological makeup of this man who says, "Women are always unfaithful...it comes naturally to them," and sets out to make them prove he is right.

The sets were very well done, and changes not too time-consuming. Background music and lighting were also good. The guild is making real progress in transforming Room J-303 into an intimate little theater.

"The Affairs of Anatol" can be seen again this weekend, May 17-20, on the OCC campus, 1-696 and Orchard Lake Road. Tickets will be sold at the door.

U-D Honors Miss Severo

Sandra Severo of Livonia, founder and director of the Severo Ballet Company, will be honored by the University of Detroit's President's Cabinet at its sixth annual awards dinner.

This will be held Saturday, May 19, in Detroit's Cobo Hall Convention Center.

Miss Severo will receive the "treasured president's cabinet medallion along with Marshall Fredericks, world-renowned sculptor and creator of the "Spirit of Detroit" sculpture; Dr. Robert A. Good, internationally known immunologist who has pioneered research efforts to ward off the threat of cancer; and the Rev. Robert F. Drinan, S.J., U.S. Congressman from Massachusetts' 4th District.

The medallion is the second highest honor bestowed by the university. It is ranked only by an honorary degree.

Dan Rather, CBS News White House correspondent, will serve as the evening's toastmaster. The invocation will be delivered by the Ven. H. Irving Mayson, archdeacon of the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan.

The \$1,000-a-table dinner is an annual event sponsored by the university's major donors to single out outstanding men and women who have made significant contributions to our way of life. Some 1,000 civic, political, industrial, educational and religious leaders from throughout the country are expected to attend.

Miss Severo, who is a native of Detroit, moved to Livonia in 1969.
