The work consists of the extension and replacement of 4" concrete sidewalks per drawings and specifications.

The Owner will require the accepted bidder to provide a Performance Bond in the amount of 100% of the contract, including all labor and material.

Proposals must be submitted on forms furnished by the Board of Education and must be accompanied by a certified check or bidder's bond, payable to the Board of Education of Farmington Public Schools for a sum not less than Five Per Cent (5%) of the amount of the proposal.

All proposals shall remain firm for a period of sixty (60) days after official opening of bids.
