

# Resources Group Expanded

LANSING  
Observerland State Senators joined the majority of their colleagues in supporting a bill to enlarge the Natural Resources Commission from five to seven members.

In a 28-3 vote, the Senate enlarged the commission to cover the added duties assumed by the DNR under Gov. Milliken's departmental reorganization.

## SC Offers Recreation Classes

Schoolcraft College is offering a number of physical education and recreation classes during June and July. Registration is set for May 22 and 23.

The classes include gym and swim for individuals and families; competitive and beginning diving; parent and tot swim; folk and square dances; beginning golf and gymnastics.

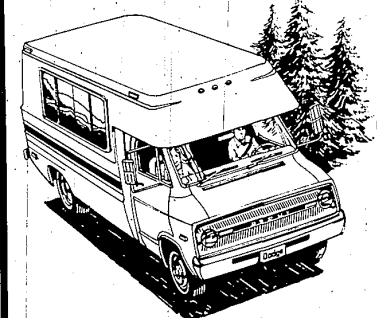

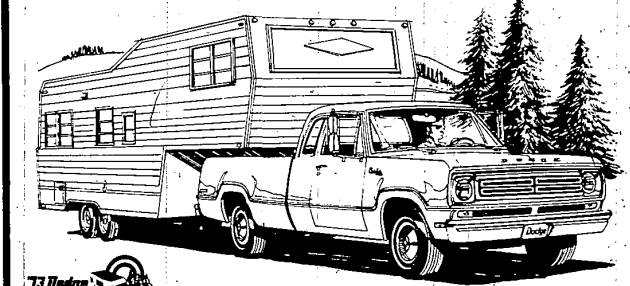
