

# Falcons Cinch Share Of Court Crown

## 'Big John' Leads Farmington Past Skippers, 67-36

Paced by John McCaffrey's 20 points, the Farmington Falcons clinched no less than a tie for first place in the Inter-Lakes League by drubbing Waterford 67-36 last Friday on Farmington's home court.

Waterford didn't even make a game of it. The victory avenged the Falcons' defeat at the hands of the Skippers earlier in the season.

Everyone in the Farmington lineup scored.

The Falcons jumped off to a commanding 16-2 lead in the first quarter. McCaffrey scored 8 of the 16 points, while John Fawcett picked up 4, Chuck Maki 3, and Jim Drewbaker 2.

Farmington kept their terrific pace in the second quarter by outscoring the Skippers 14-5. Fawcett's 16 points were enough to lead the scoring in this quarter. He was followed by McCaffrey with four, Jerry Rice and Jim Drewbaker with two each.

Farmington really started pulling away in the third quarter. The Falcons pumped in 19 points while Waterford got 14. Frank DelMonte scored seven points to pace the scoring. McCaffrey followed with five; Rice four and Fawcett three.

Although Coach Robert Burtch substituted freely throughout the last period, Waterford still could not hold the Falcons down. Farmington scored 18 points while the Skippers could get 15. Ron Donaghue led the fourth quarter scoring with six points. He was followed by Captain Wayne Dryden with four, Alan Alexander and McCaffrey three, and Dick Goulet two.

Farmington will take the floor against Van Dyke tomorrow night in the last game of the season. Victory will make the Falcons undisputed champions of the Inter-Lakes League. This is a home game.
