north of Grand River. The Board was advised that Wheeler, Rose-volt, Jefferson and Jacksonville, north of Independence, were nearly impassable. It was suggested that some heavy stone fill might be placed as a temporary measure. Several members of the Board stated that the ditches along these streets should be opened up to provide proper drainage before any major work is done. The Board agreed to check the situation with the County Road Commission to see if anything could be done at this time.

DETROIT POLICE DROP CHARGES AGAINST TEDDY

Detroit police have exonerated Garfield Teddy, of Vassar, Michigan, of any connection with a gang which recently admitted 27 cases of breaking and entering in the Wayne, Oakland and Macomb County areas.

under the supervision of bond attorneys. Tennant explained that the proposed financing plan, as well as the proposed elimination of existing septic tanks within a period of 12 to 18 months, were important factors in the state's consideration of the plan design. The City Manager pointed out that it is illegal to use public funds for improvements or installations on private property. Thus it is proposed to use a portion of the money from the sale of bonds to create a revolving fund to handle the expense of eliminating septic tanks.

The tanks would be removed or adapted to the new system with the cost being billed back to the property owner by the city. The cost would be paid in five equal installments plus interest of 6% or could be paid in full, eliminating the interest charge. Any money paid, including interest, would revert to the revolving fund and at the end of five years the fund would be liquidated with the proceeds used to aid in the retirement of the bonds.

The City Manager emphasized that this is only a proposal and is subject to formal approval both by the City Council and the bond attorney.
