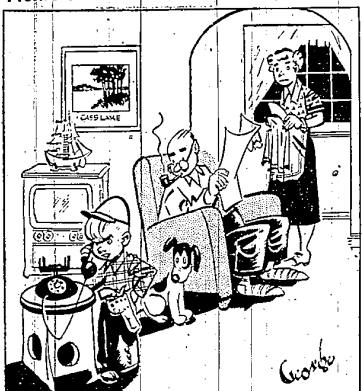

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Novi Civic Highlights

At its January 30 meeting the West Road Property Holders Association, Inc., discussed the published figures on percentage of school children immunized against diphtheria and smallpox. The immunization record for those of the West Road was even below the low Novi Township figures. Parents were urged to secure immunization of their children. It was reported that, at certain designated times weekly, the Novi Health authorities in Pontiac give inoculation without charge.

Members discussed local taxation, particularly with reference to school needs. On resolution presented by Mr. James G. Wason, the members unanimously voiced their disapproval of the proposed county tax to build a new county building.

A plan for local police protection for Novi Township was another subject of interest. Much ground work and data compilation has to be effected in order to present a completely detailed outline to the Township Board.

LIST CAUSES FOR SEPTIC TANK FAILURE

Suburban dwellers who wonder why their septic tanks fail to operate may find the answers in an Ingham County study report at Michigan State College by the county sanitarian, Philip V. Shirley.

The lists eight reasons for troubles. More people per house than when units were set up, more water per person with automatic appliances, more homes being built on low, wet sites with poor drainage, and more seasonal high levels of ground water.

Heavy subsoils good for foundations are poor for drainage and Shirley believes many sites, might better have remained in agricultural use. More runoff comes from larger homes with larger roof areas and more paved drives, walks and yard areas. Laws have stopped drainage via county drains to a great extent and sanitary sewers have not kept pace. Detergents have an upsetting effect on septic systems.
