His book "Psychology, Religion and Healing" has been received the world over as an authoritative study of all the techniques and practices usually described as faith healing and mental therapy. It has placed him in the position of a widely recognized international authority in the field of non-medical healing.

Dr. Weatherhead has given lectures series in many universities all over the English speaking world. His most recent appearance was at Yale University Divinity School where he delivered the Beecher Lectures on preaching to rapidly increasing, white thousands were turned away.
