cussion of definite sites for the three proposed elementary schools to be built. Board member Bayard Tupper and Superintendent Fanciel were detailed to obtain all information relating to obtaining options on proposed sites now under consideration by the Board. A study of preliminary building plans was made with discussion following. Upon the recommendation of Superintendent Dunkel, it was decided that school staff members be called in to get their views on building specifications. A tentative meeting of teaching staff representatives, school administrators, the School Board and the school architect has been set for Friday, April 23. Recommendation for the addition of two elementary teachers was approved by the Board. The new teachers to be added to the school system are Dorothy Ann Cox, former teacher in New York City schools, and Carl Wilson, a teacher at Osgood, Michigan, for the past five years.

show that the vaccine won't damage the kidneys.

Questions on whether or not the Brobner "BT" virus — an extremely rare virus known to have affected only four persons in medical history — would be present in the vaccine were answered satisfactorily. The same assurances would be given by Dr. Rivers as to the absence of this virus as are given in regard to the absence of live polio virus. Dr. Rivers' group will also certify as to the antibody producing ability of the vaccine.

The polio foundation made it clear that it stands behind the product and assumes all legal responsibility for the product itself.

The Foundation has given assurances to Dr. Heustalt that the vaccine will be available to begin the trials in Michigan by April 15. Members of the Committee Who
