**GM To Rebuild Livonia Plant**

**Of interest to Farmington residents will be the disclosure that General Motors will build a new Fisher body fabricating plant on the site of GM's former Detroit Transmission Division plant in Livonia. This was revealed by General Motors Corporation last week.**

**Harlow H. Curtice, president of the corporation, said construction of the plant will be a part of the Fisher Body expansion program as it is related to the General Motors billion dollar expansion program announced last January.**

**The Fisher Body Division's building program for the plant will add approximately 628,000 square feet to the building structure still standing after the fire of August 12, 1952. That will bring the total plant area to approximately 920,000 square feet when construction is completed early in 1955.**

**Structures still standing at Livonia contain some 292,000 square feet. Fisher Body will use 92,000 square feet of this space for offices, cafeteria, locker rooms and hospital. The remaining 200,000 square feet will be used soon for production operations. Rehabilitation of standing building structures will begin shortly, James E. Goodman, GM vice president and general manager of Fisher Body, said.**

**Eventual employment at the new Fisher body facility is expected to total approximately 3,000.**
